You asked for the following information from the Ministry of Justice (MoJ):

Data on an all offence basis in the magistrates courts, rather than on a principal offence basis. I had no way of knowing this as I asked exactly the same question as Josie Appleton. So once again I'm looking for the number of prosecutions for the offence of failing to comply with a Community Protection Notice in the year between 1 October 2015 and 30 September 2016. Also The number of these prosecutions which were successful.
