**Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Request – 180319014**

You asked for the following information from the Ministry of Justice (MoJ):

**In respect of each of the following claims issued in the Employment Tribunals of England and Wales:**

**Race discrimination  
Sex discrimination  
Disability discrimination  
Age discrimination  
Religion/belief discrimination  
Sexual orientation discrimination**

**Please provide the following information for claims accepted by the Employment Tribunals of England and Wales over the last 12 months:**

- (a) How many claims were submitted in respect of each type of claim?**
- (b) How many Deposit Orders were made in respect of each type of claim?**
- (c) How many claims were struck out in respect of each type of claim?**

Your request has been handled under the FOIA.

I can confirm that the MoJ holds the information requested and I have provided it in the attached tabulation.

Notes regarding the attached data:

- You have been provided with the number of single and multiple accepted claims in the reporting period where the main jurisdiction is either Age discrimination, Disability discrimination, Race discrimination, Religious Belief discrimination, Sex discrimination and Sexual Orientation discrimination.

- Number of single and multiple claims struck out (not at a hearing) was formerly known as “Disposed of/Otherwise”. Note that the claims disposed would not necessarily have been received in the same reporting period.
- An Employment Tribunal claim can be made of one or more jurisdictional complaint. A deposit order can be made for all or part of the claim. You have been provided with the number of jurisdictional complaints from both single and multiple claims where a deposit order is requested for one or more of the associated jurisdictions listed.
- Although care is taken when processing and analysing the data, the details are subject to inaccuracies inherent in any large-scale recording system and it is the best data that is available.
- The data has not been checked against published statistics or against information held in individual case files.

If you are not satisfied with this response you have the right to request an internal review by responding in writing to one of the addresses below within two months of the date of this response.
