SRS Automation Portfolio – CEP Debit Automation Solution

1 Solution Summary

This solution summary has been updated to reflect the extension of Phase 7 automation and the extension of the SRS deadline for automated queries.

The CEP Debit solution is required to answer queries around memberships where a Contribution Equivalent Premium (CEP) method of preservation has incorrectly been added to a membership.


Pension schemes can request to pay a CEP to replace the liability in the scheme, where the actual period of scheme membership is less than 2 years or 5 years (depending on the period end date).

So as to confirm the membership is correctly recorded on HMRC records, a debit of the CEP membership is required. Following the debit of the CEP membership, it will be updated to either GMP and/or COSR Rights method of preservation based on the period end date.

2 Solution inputs

This solution will require SRS query template input files containing the CEP Debit queries from the schemes in question.

All input files should be formatted with the headers below.



Orange fields denote mandatory fields.

Green fields denote that either Surname (HMRC) or Surname (Scheme) should be populated.

3 Solution outputs

This solution will output 1 file of rejected queries, 1 file of query responses, and 1 file of remainder cases for each query input file received.

Every query from the input files will be accounted for in the solution output, i.e. every query will occur on either the reject file, the response file, or the remainder file.

3.1 Rejected queries

The format of data fields on the input files will be checked to ensure that the automated exercise does not fall over during the automation process – one incorrectly formatted field could cause the whole exercise to fail or incorrect results to be generated,. Schemes are advised to follow the instructions below on input file content/formatting.

A list of the queries from the input file query template with incorrectly formatted and/or incomplete input information will be rejected and output in a file to be returned to the scheme.. If no query has been rejected, a blank reject file will be returned to the scheme for consistency.

3.2 Query response file

Query responses will be provided to schemes in the query response files. All query response files should be formatted with the headers as shown below.

Please note, two additional columns will be added to the query response file, Scheme SCON and Scheme Name.

An appropriate HMRC comment will be given to inform the schemes of membership details, where available. Otherwise an explanation as to why this information cannot be provided will be given. A full list of HMRC comments that may appear on the query response file is shown below in sections 3.2.1 and 3.2.2:.

3.2.1 Comments corresponding to basic checks:

The first stage of this solution runs basic checks against the input data provided from PSA's. If the query fails one of these basic checks, the solution will output one of the following comments on the query response file:

No liability output as no qualifying spouse for this deceased member	If the individual in question is deceased, the solution will verify whether the individual has a qualifying (surviving, non-redundant) spouse. If no qualifying spouse exists for the deceased individual on HMRC records, this comment will be provided in the "HMRC Comments" field on the query response file.
MWRR paid until <i>dd/mm/yyyy</i> OR MWRR recorded up to SPA	The solution will check whether a period of "Married Women Reduced Rate" (MWRR) liabilities exists that covers the period on the input query file or else covers the period up to the date of State Pension Age (SPA). If so, this comment will be provided in the "HMRC Comments" field on the query response file.
Scheme Membership start date provided is after the FRY of SPA	The solution will check whether the membership period on input query file started before final relevant year + 1. (Note: Final Relevant Year (FRY) is the last complete tax year before reaching SPA i.e. the tax year in which the individual reaches SPA is the FRY + 1). If the membership period on input file started in FRY + 1 or later, this comment will be provided in the "HMRC Comments" field on the query response file.

3.2.2 Comments corresponding to memberships details

The second stage of this solution is to check all the membership details for the queries that passed the basic checks. These memberships are output onto the query response file, along with one of the following comments explaining why:

3.2.3 Additional information provided on the query response file

During the second stage of this solution while checking all the membership details for the queries that passed the basic checks, in two cases the values provided on the query file will be overwritten. These memberships are output onto the query response file, along with the original values explaining the reasons why below:

Case 1: Start date in HMRC records within +1/-1 tax year

3.3 Remainder file

For queries where a fully automated response is not provided by the CEP Debit Automation Solution, they will be output into the remainder file.

Where a duplicate NI No with the same scon is included in the same run of the solution, these queries will also be put into the remainder file.

Clerical work will no longer be performed for any queries in the remainder file that were submitted after the deadline date of 31st October 2018 for Live Schemes and of 31st December 2018 for Scheme Cessation queries. The remainder files will therefore be provided to schemes with no action performed on these queries.
