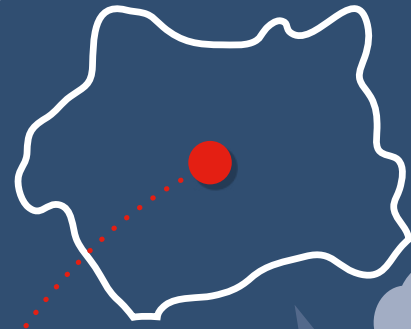
Industrial Strategy highlights include:

 Investment to support the Northern Alliance Advanced Therapies Treatment Centre to deliver advanced therapies and treatments to NHS patients.

 **£20m** for flood resilience packages in Bradford, Calderdale, Craven, Kirklees and Leeds.

 Funding to provide residents with the digital connectivity they need through improvements in the availability of full fibre broadband.

 **1,456,200** people in employment, an increase of **110,900** since 2010. **88,300** workers directly benefiting from the National Living and Minimum Wages. **29,720** apprenticeships starts last year.

Case study: NEXUS Innovation Centre

The NEXUS Innovation Centre, opened Spring 2019 at the University of Leeds, is helping to expand business innovation and incubation space in the Leeds City Region. The £3m Local Growth Fund investment, which is part of the University's overall campus investment of £520m, will help businesses more easily access the University's world-class research expertise and increase the amount of 'wet' and 'dry' lab space for businesses looking to innovate. More than 500 businesses are expected to benefit from NEXUS over the next few years.
