PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information on live animal exports which we received on 31 May 2018. Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOI).

The information you requested and our response is detailed below:

'Would you please forward me copies of all journey logs issued so far this year for journey's starting in Scotland and transporting live sheep and cattle to slaughter or further fattening/production. These journeys would all be in excess of eight hours. please also indicate which of any journeys had two drivers listed on the log.'

Please find enclosed copies of the 38 Journey Logs (JL's) for the transport of cattle and sheep for the purposes of further fattening and for slaughter, with consignments originating in Scotland. We have enclosed only those journey logs that have been returned to date.

The journey logs have been name Appendix 1 through to Appendix 38 and the following list shows the corresponding Appendix number to the corresponding Journey log number.

None of the JLs attached show the signatory of two drivers.

Information has been redacted in the attached Appendices under Section 38, Section 40(2) of the Freedom of Information Act (2000) and Article 5(f) of the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR).

Section 38

Section 38(1) refers to the exemption from the duty to provide information if it would, or would be likely to affect anyone's health or safety.

The exemption in Section 38(1) is subject to a Public Interest Test to ensure it is being appropriately applied.

Public Interest Test

We recognise that there is a general presumption in favour of transparency and openness concerning our work, and providing the general public with the right to request access to information held by public authorities.

We also recognise that there is a public interest in disclosure of this specific information in order to increase this transparency and aid well-informed debates concerning the welfare and transportation of animals, and the individuals associated with them.

However, we feel that there is a stronger public interest in withholding the information as the full addresses, including the county of origin, the full address of the destination and/or rest stops, transporter details and individual names would identify further information and would, or would be likely to, endanger the health and safety of individuals and staff. This poses a substantial risk to the health and safety of individuals associated with the transportation of animals that would be of significant severity and is likely to occur in some cases. We consider this to be a significant factor in favour of maintaining the exemption.

APHA has balanced the real threat to the health and safety of individuals which disclosure of the requested information would be likely to cause, against the public interest arguments in favour of disclosure. In this instance the APHA does not consider that disclosing the information requested in order to inform public debate and to promote accountability and transparency would justify the risk to individuals' health and safety.

Section 40

Some of the information contained within the requested documents has been withheld under section 40(2) of the FOIA as the information constitutes personal data relating to a third party. The FOIA provides that personal data relating to third parties is exempt information. The release of third party information, if disclosed, would also breach Article 5(f) of the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) - Principles relating to processing of personal data.

APHA consider that disclosure of this information is likely to breach section 40(2) of the FOIA and Article 5(f) of the GDPR, which relates to appropriate security of personal data, including protection against unauthorized or unlawful processing. Therefore, we have concluded that this information is withheld.

Information disclosed in response to this FOI request is releasable to the public. In keeping with the spirit and effect of the FOI and the government's Transparency Agenda, this letter and the information disclosed to you may be placed on GOV.UK, together with

any related information that will provide a key to its wider context. No information identifying you will be placed on the GOV.UK website.
