Appendix 3

Construction Services

Definition:

For the purposes of the Chapter on Public Procurement, a construction services or works contract is a contract which has as its objective the realisation by whatever means of civil or building works, in the sense of Division 51 of the Central Product Classification.

The provisions of the Chapter on Public Procurement shall apply to the procurement of construction services contained in Division 51 of the Central Product Classification.

Appendix 4

General Notes and Derogations from the provisions of Chapter 3 of Title IV

SIGNATORY CARIFORUM STATES

- 1. Subject to paragraph 6, the provisions of Chapter 3 of Title IV shall be applicable to the entities as listed under Appendix 1, and do not include other agencies of government which may fall within the portfolio of the listed entities.
- 2. The provisions of Chapter 3 of Title IV shall not be applicable to procurement by the covered entities listed under Appendix 1 in connection with activities in the field of energy and the postal sector.
- 3. The Signatory CARIFORUM States reserve the right to participate in public contract award procedures or to provide for such contracts to be performed in the context of sheltered projects or programmes,

including sheltered employment programmes for the handicapped or incarcerated, and relief employment programmes and projects.

- 4. By derogation to Article 171(2)(f), the total value of contracts awarded for the additional services shall not exceed one hundred % of the amount of the original contract.
- 5. The primary means of publication in respect of Annex VII Parts 1, 2 and 3, shall be the CARIFORUM regional on-line facility established pursuant to the provisions of Article 182(2) and consistent with the provisions of Article 180(4).
- 6. There is no obligation on CARIFORUM States to officially publish judicial decisions.
- 7. In respect of the Dominican Republic, the provisions of Chapter 3 of Title IV shall apply to the entities listed in Appendix 1 including gobernaciones and other agencies of government that fall within the portfolio of such entities, except under the following circumstances and conditions:
 - (a) Secretaría de Estado de Interior y Policía: This Chapter does not cover: (a) procurement by the Dirección General de Migración; or (b) procurement by the Policía Nacional of: (i) goods classified under Group 447 (weapons and ammunition and parts thereof) of the United Nations Central Product Classification 1.0 (CPC, version 1.0), or (ii) combat, assault and tactical vehicles.
 - (b) Policía Nacional in the Secretaría de Estado de Interior y Policía and Secretaría de Estado de las Fuerzas Armadas: This Chapter does not cover procurement of goods classified under Section 2 (food products, beverages and tobacco; textiles, apparel and leather products) of the CPC.
 - (c) Secretaría de Estado de las Fuerzas Armadas: This Chapter does not cover: (a) procurement by the Departamento Nacional de Investigación, and the Instituto de Altos Estudios para la Defensa y Seguridad Nacional; or (b) procurement of: (i) goods classified under Group 447 (weapons and ammunition and parts thereof) of the CPC;
 (ii) aircraft, airframe structural components, aircraft components, parts and accessories; (iii) landing and ground handling equipment; (iv) docks; (v) ships and ship components, parts and accessories; (vi) marine equipment; or

(vii) combat, assault and tactical vehicles.

- (d) Secretaría de Estado de Relaciones Exteriores: This Chapter does not cover procurement by the Dirección General de Pasaportes for the production of passports.
- (e) Secretaría de Estado de Agricultura: This Chapter does not cover procurement made in furtherance of agricultural support programs.
- (f) Secretaría de Estado de Hacienda: This Chapter does not cover procurement by the Tesorería Nacional with regard to the issuance of tax stamps or postage stamps, or the production of checks and treasury bonds.
- (g) Secretaría de Estado de Educación: This Chapter does not cover procurement made in furtherance of school feeding programs (Desayuno Escolar) or programs to support the dissemination of education, the well-being of students, or the accessibility of education, including at the border with Haiti (Zona Fronteriza) and in other rural or impoverished areas.
- (h) Secretariado Técnico de la Presidencia: This Chapter does not cover procurement by the Comisión Nacional de Asuntos Nucleares.
- (i) Instituto Dominicano de las Telecomunicaciones (INDOTEL): This Chapter does not apply to procurement of goods and services required for the implementation of special projects executed by the Fondo de Desarrollo de las Telecomunicaciones to implement the Política Social sobre Servicio Universal of the Dominican Republic pursuant to the Ley General de Telecomunicaciones No.153-98 and Reglamento del Fondo de Desarrollo de las Telecomunicaciones.
- (j) Banco Central de la República Dominicana: This Chapter does not cover the issuance of currency and coins.

THE UNITED KINGDOM

- 1. Procurement by procuring entities covered under Appendix 1 in connection with activities in the fields of drinking water, energy, transport and the postal sector are not covered by Chapter 3 of Title IV.
- 2. The United Kingdom may reserve the right to participate in public contract award procedures to sheltered workshops or provide for such contracts to be performed in the context of sheltered employment programmes where most of the employees concerned are handicapped persons who, by reason of the nature or the seriousness of their disabilities, cannot carry on occupations under normal conditions.

ANNEX VIII

RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR DISPUTE SETTLEMENT

Article 1 General provisions

- 1. The Parties agree that the establishment of the Rules of Procedure for Dispute Settlement and the Code of Conduct for Arbitrators and Mediators supersedes the establishment of the Rules of Procedure for Dispute Settlement and Code of Conduct for Arbitrators and Mediators by Decision 1/2010 of the Joint CARIFORUM-EU Council.
- 2. In Part III (Dispute Avoidance and Settlement) of the Agreement and under these Rules:
 - 'adviser' means a person retained by a Party to advise or assist that Party in connection with the arbitration panel proceeding;
 - 'assistant' means a person who, under the terms of appointment of a member of an arbitration panel, conducts research or provides assistance to that member;
 - 'complaining Party' means any Party that requests the establishment of an arbitration panel under Article 207 of the Agreement;
 - Party complained against' means the Party that is alleged to be in violation of the provisions referred to in Article 203 of the Agreement;
 - 'arbitration panel' means a panel established under Article 207 of the Agreement;
 - 'representative of a Party' means an employee or any person appointed by a government department or agency or any other public entity of a Party;
 - 'day' means a calendar day, unless otherwise specified.
- 3. The Party complained against shall be in charge of the logistical administration of dispute settlement proceedings, in particular the organisation of hearings, unless otherwise agreed.
- 4. The United Kingdom shall bear the expenses derived from all organisational matters¹ regarding consultations, mediation and arbitration, with the exception of the remuneration and expenses to be paid to the mediators and arbitrators, which shall be shared².
- 5. The Parties shall exchange a list of dates of their official holidays and rest days on the first Monday of every December for the following year. If a period referred to in these Rules of Procedure ends on an official holiday or rest day of either of the Parties, the period shall be deemed to expire on the next business day. No documents, notifications or requests of any kind shall be deemed to be received on an official holiday or rest day.

Article 2

Notifications

- 1. The Parties and the arbitration panel shall transmit any request, notice, written submission or other document by email, with a copy submitted on the same day by facsimile transmission, registered post, courier, delivery against receipt or any other means of telecommunication that provides a record of the sending thereof. Unless proven otherwise, an e-mail message shall be deemed to be received on the day it is sent.
- 2. A Party shall provide an electronic copy of each of its written submissions to the other Party and to each of the arbitrators. A paper copy shall also be provided.
- 3. The designated point of contact for all notifications for the CARIFORUM States shall be the CARIFORUM Coordinator, provided for under Article 234(1) of the Agreement, and for the United Kingdom shall be the Department for International Trade of the United Kingdom, or its successor. The Parties shall immediately inform each other of any change in the designated point of contact.
- 4. Minor errors of a clerical nature in any request, notice, written submission or other document related to the arbitration panel proceeding may be corrected by delivery of a new document clearly indicating the changes.
- 5. Depending on the object of the provisions under dispute, all requests and notifications addressed to the CARIFORUM-UK Trade and Development Committee shall also be copied to the other relevant sub-committees established by or under the Agreement.

¹ Any such expenses incurred shall be informed by value for money considerations.

² It is understood that the remuneration of officials, representatives or advisers of any Party involved in the organisation of the hearings shall not form part of the expenses deriving from organisational matters.

Article 3 Commencing the arbitration

1. Unless the Parties agree otherwise, they shall meet the arbitration panel within 10 days of its establishment in order to determine such matters that the Parties or the arbitration panel deem appropriate, including the remuneration and expenses to be paid to the arbitrators, which shall be in accordance with WTO standards. Members of the arbitration panel and representatives of the Parties may take part in this meeting via telephone or video conference.

2.

(a) Unless the Parties agree otherwise, within seven days from the date of the establishment of the panel, the terms of reference of the arbitration panel shall be:

"to examine, in the light of the relevant provisions of the Agreement, the matter referred to in the request for establishment of the arbitration panel, to rule on the compatibility of the measure in question with the provisions of the Agreement identified in the Request for Establishment and to make a ruling in accordance with Article 209 of the Agreement."

(b) The Parties shall notify the agreed terms of reference to the arbitration panel within five days of their agreement.

Article 4

Initial submissions

The complaining Party shall deliver its initial written submission no later than 20 days after the date of establishment of the arbitration panel. The Party complained against shall deliver its written counter-submission no later than 20 days after the date of delivery of the initial written submission.

Article 5 **Operation of arbitration panels**

- 1. The chairperson of the arbitration panel shall preside at all its meetings. An arbitration panel may delegate to the chairperson authority to make administrative and procedural decisions.
- 2. Unless otherwise provided, the arbitration panel may conduct its activities by any means, including telephone, facsimile transmissions or computer links.
- 3. Only arbitrators may take part in the deliberations of the arbitration panel, but the arbitration panel may permit its assistants to be present at its deliberations.
- 4. The drafting of any ruling shall remain the exclusive responsibility of the arbitration panel and shall not be delegated.
- 5. Where a procedural question arises that is not covered by the provisions of the Agreement or these Rules, the arbitration panel, after consulting the Parties, may adopt an appropriate procedure compatible with the Agreement and these Rules, which ensures an equal treatment of the Parties.
- 6. When the arbitration panel considers that there is a need to modify any time limit applicable in the proceedings or to make any other procedural or administrative adjustment, it shall inform the Parties in writing of the reasons for the modification or adjustment and of the period or adjustment needed. The arbitration panel may adopt such modification or adjustment after consulting the Parties. The time limits in Article 209 of the Agreement shall not be modified.

Article 6

Replacement

- 1. If an arbitrator is unable to participate in the proceeding, withdraws, or must be replaced, a replacement shall be selected in accordance with Article 207(3) of the Agreement.
- 2. Where a Party considers that an arbitrator does not comply with the requirements of the Code of Conduct for Arbitrators and Mediators (hereinafter the 'Code of Conduct') and for this reason should be replaced, that Party should notify the other Party within 15 days from the time at which it came to know of the circumstances underlying the arbitrator's material violation of the Code of Conduct.

Where a Party considers that an arbitrator other than the chairperson does not comply with the requirements of the Code of Conduct, the Parties shall consult and, if they so agree, shall dismiss the arbitrator and select a replacement following the procedure set out in Article 207(3) of the Agreement.

If the Parties fail to agree on the need to replace an arbitrator, any Party may request that such matter be referred to the chairperson of the arbitration panel, whose decision shall be final.

If the chairperson finds that an arbitrator does not comply with the requirements of the Code of Conduct, she or he shall select a new arbitrator by lot from the list of individuals referred to under Article 221 of the Agreement in

which the original arbitrator appeared. If the original arbitrator was chosen by the Parties pursuant to Article 207(2) of the Agreement, the replacement shall be selected by lot from the lists of individuals that have been proposed by the complaining Party and by the Party complained against under Article 221 of the Agreement. The selection of the new arbitrator shall be made within five days of the date of submission of the request to the chairperson of the arbitration panel.

3. Where a Party considers that the chairperson of the arbitration panel does not comply with the requirements of the Code of Conduct, the Parties shall consult and, if they so agree, replace the chairperson and select a replacement following the procedure set out in Article 207(3) of the Agreement.

If the Parties fail to agree on the need to replace the chairperson, any Party may request that such matter be referred to one of the remaining members of the list of individuals selected to act as chairperson under Article 221(1) of the Agreement. Her or his name shall be drawn by lot by the chairperson of the CARIFORUM-UK Trade and Development Committee, or the chairperson's delegate. The decision by that person on the need to replace the chairperson shall be final.

If that person decides that the original chairperson does not comply with the requirements of the Code of Conduct, she or he shall select a new chairperson by lot from the remaining list of individuals referred to under Article 221(1) of the Agreement who may act as chairpersons. This selection of the new chairperson shall be made within five days of the date of submission of the request referred to in this paragraph.

4. The arbitration panel proceedings shall be suspended for the period taken to carry out the procedures provided for in this Article.

Article 7 Hearings

- 1. The chairperson shall fix the date and time of the hearing in consultation with the Parties and the other members of the arbitration panel, and confirm this in writing to the Parties. This information shall also be made publicly available by the Party in charge of the logistical administration of the proceedings if the hearing is open to the public. Unless a Party disagrees, the arbitration panel may decide not to convene a hearing.
- 2. Unless the Parties agree otherwise, the hearing shall be held in London if the complaining Party is the CARIFORUM States and in the territories of the CARIFORUM States if the complaining Party is the United Kingdom. If the dispute concerns a measure maintained by a Signatory CARIFORUM State, the hearing shall take place in the territory of that State unless the State gives written notice to the panel within 10 days of its establishment that another venue should be used.
- 3. The arbitration panel may convene one additional hearing only in exceptional circumstances. No additional hearing shall be convened for the procedures established under Articles 211(2), 212(2) and 214(2) of the Agreement.
- 4. All arbitrators shall be present during the entirety of any hearings.
- 5. The following persons may attend the hearing, irrespective of whether the proceedings are open to the public or not:
 - (a) representatives of the Parties;
 - (b) advisers to the Parties;
 - (c) administrative staff, interpreters, translators and court reporters; and
 - (d) arbitrators' assistants.

Only the representatives and advisers of the Parties may address the arbitration panel.

- 6. No later than seven days before the date of a hearing, each Party shall deliver to the arbitration panel a list of the names of persons who will make oral arguments or presentations at the hearing on behalf of that Party and of other representatives or advisers who will be attending the hearing.
- 7. Pursuant to Article 216 of the Agreement, the hearings of the arbitration panels shall be open to the public, unless the arbitration panel decides otherwise. However, the arbitration panel shall meet in closed session when the submission and arguments of a Party contain confidential commercial information. The panel shall, in consultation with the Parties, decide on appropriate logistical arrangements and procedures to ensure that hearings which are open are managed in an effective way. These procedures could include the use of live web-broadcasting or of closed-circuit television.
- 8. The arbitration panel shall conduct the hearing in the following manner:

Arguments:

- (a) arguments of the complaining Party
- (b) arguments of the Party complained against.

Rebuttal Arguments:

- (a) arguments of the complaining Party
- (b) counter-reply of the Party complained against.
- 9. The arbitration panel may direct questions to either Party at any time during the hearing.
- 10. The arbitration panel shall arrange for a transcript of each hearing to be prepared and delivered as soon as possible to the Parties.
- 11. Each Party may deliver a supplementary written submission concerning any matter that arose during the hearing within 14 days of the date of the hearing.

Article 8 **Ouestions in writing**

- 1. The arbitration panel may at any time during the proceedings address questions in writing to one or both Parties. Each of the Parties shall receive a copy of any questions put by the arbitration panel.
- 2. A Party shall also provide the other Party with a copy of its written response to the questions of the arbitration panel. Each Party shall be given the opportunity to provide written comments on the other Party's reply within seven days of the date of receipt.

Article 9 Confidentiality

The Parties shall maintain the confidentiality of the arbitration panel hearings where the hearings are held in closed session, in accordance with Article 7(7) of these Rules. Each Party shall treat as confidential any information submitted by the other Party to the arbitration panel which that Party has designated as confidential. Where a Party submits a confidential version of its written submissions to the arbitration panel, it shall also, upon request of the other Party, provide a non-confidential summary of the information contained in its submissions that could be disclosed to the public no later than 15 days after the date of either the request or the submission, whichever is later. Nothing in these Rules shall preclude a Party from disclosing statements of its own positions to the public.

Article 10

Ex parte contacts

- 1. The arbitration panel shall not meet or contact a Party in the absence of the other Party.
- 2. No member of the arbitration panel may discuss any aspect of the subject matter of the proceedings with one Party or both Parties in the absence of the other arbitrators.

Article 11

Amicus curiae submissions

- 1. Pursuant to Article 217 of the Agreement, the arbitration panel may receive unsolicited written submissions, provided that they are made within 15 days of the date of establishment of the arbitration panel, that they are concise and in no case longer than 15 typed pages, including any annexes, and that they are directly relevant to the issues under consideration by the arbitration panel.
- 2. The submission shall contain a description of the person making the submission, whether natural or legal, including the nature of that person's activities and the source of that person's financing, and specify the nature of the interest that the person has in the arbitration proceeding. It shall be drafted in the languages chosen by the Parties in accordance with Article 218 of the Agreement and Article 14 of these Rules of Procedure.
- 3. The arbitration panel shall list in its ruling all the submissions it has received that conform to the requirements in paragraphs 1 and 2. The arbitration panel shall not be obliged to address in its ruling the arguments made in such submissions. Any submission obtained by the arbitration panel under this rule shall be submitted to the Parties for their comments.

Article 12

Information or technical advice

Where, pursuant to Article 217 of the Agreement, a panel solicits information or technical advice from persons or entities other than the Parties, it shall notify the Parties of its intention to seek such information or technical advice and provide them with the opportunity to submit comments. The panel shall take into consideration the comments of the Parties on any information or technical advice received in cases where the panel takes into consideration such information or technical advice in the preparation of its ruling.

Article 13

Urgent cases

In cases of urgency referred to in Chapter 2 of Part III of the Agreement, the arbitration panel, after consulting the Parties, shall adjust the time limits referred to in these Rules as appropriate and shall notify the Parties of such adjustments.

Article 14

Translation and interpretation

- 1. During the consultations referred to in Article 204 of the Agreement, and no later than the meeting referred to in Article 3(1) of these Rules, the Parties shall endeavour to agree on a common working language for the proceedings before the arbitration panel.
- 2. The Party complained against shall arrange for the interpretation of oral submissions into the languages chosen by the Parties.
- 3. Arbitration panel rulings shall be notified in the language or languages chosen by the Parties.
- 4. Any Party may provide comments on any translated version of a document drawn up in accordance with these Rules.

Article 15 Calculation of time-limits

Where, by reason of the application of Article 1(5) of these Rules, a Party receives a document on a date other than the date on which the document is received by the other Party, any period of time that is calculated on the basis of the date of receipt of that document shall be calculated from the last date of receipt of that document.

Article 16 Other procedures

- 1. These Rules of Procedure are also applicable to procedures established under Articles 211(2), 212(2) and 214(2) of the Agreement. However, the time-limits laid down in these Rules shall be adjusted in line with the special time-limits provided for the adoption of a ruling by the arbitration panel in those other procedures.
- 2. In the event of the original panel, or some of its members, being unable to reconvene for the procedures established under Articles 211(2), 212(2) and 214(2) of the Agreement, the procedures set out in Article 207 of the Agreement shall apply. The time-limit for the notification of the ruling shall be extended by 15 days.

Appendix

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR ARBITRATORS AND MEDIATORS

Article 1 Definitions

In this Code of Conduct:

- (a) 'member' or 'arbitrator' means a member of an arbitration panel established under Article 207 of the Agreement;
- (b) 'mediator' means a person who conducts a mediation in accordance with Article 205 of the Agreement;
- (c) 'candidate' means an individual whose name is on the list of arbitrators referred to in Article 221 of the Agreement and who is under consideration for selection as a member of an arbitration panel under Article 207 of the Agreement;
- (d) 'assistant' means a person who, under the terms of appointment of a member, conducts research or provides assistance to the member;
- (e) 'proceeding', unless otherwise specified, means an arbitration panel proceeding under the Agreement;
- (f) 'staff', in respect of a member, means persons under the direction and control of the member, other than assistants.

Article 2 **Responsibilities to the process**

Every candidate and member shall avoid impropriety and the appearance of impropriety, shall be independent and impartial, shall avoid direct and indirect conflicts of interests and shall observe high standards of conduct so that the integrity and impartiality of the dispute settlement mechanism is preserved. Former members shall comply with the obligations established in Articles 6 and 7 of this Code of Conduct.

Article 3

Disclosure obligations

- 1. Prior to confirmation of her or his selection as a member of the arbitration panel under the Agreement, a candidate shall disclose any interest, relationship or matter that is likely to affect her or his independence or impartiality or that might reasonably create an appearance of impropriety or bias in the proceeding. To this end, a candidate shall make all reasonable efforts to become aware of any such interests, relationships and matters. These disclosure requirements shall not extend to the identification of matters whose relevance to the issues to be considered in the proceedings would be insignificant. They shall take into account the need to respect the personal privacy of those to whom this Code applies and shall not be so administratively burdensome as to make it impracticable for otherwise qualified persons to serve on panels.
- 2. A candidate or member shall only communicate matters concerning actual or potential violations of this Code of Conduct to the CARIFORUM-UK Trade and Development Committee for consideration by the Parties.
- 3. Once selected, a member shall continue to make all reasonable efforts to become aware of any interests, relationships or matters referred to in paragraph 1 and shall disclose them. The disclosure obligation is a continuing duty which requires a member to disclose any such interests, relationships or matters that may arise during any stage of the proceeding. The member shall disclose such interests, relationships or matters by informing the CARIFORUM-UK Trade and Development Committee, in writing, for consideration by the Parties.

Article 4

Duties of members

- 1. Upon selection, a member shall perform her or his duties thoroughly and expeditiously throughout the course of the proceeding, and shall do so with fairness and diligence.
- 2. A member shall consider only those issues raised in the proceeding and necessary for a ruling and shall not delegate this duty to any other person.
- 3. A member shall take all appropriate steps to ensure that her or his assistant and staff are aware of, and comply with, Articles 2, 3 and 7 of this Code of Conduct.
- 4. A member shall not engage in *ex parte* contacts concerning the proceeding.

Article 5

Independence and impartiality of members

- 1. A member shall be independent and impartial and avoid creating an appearance of impropriety or bias and shall not be influenced by self-interest, outside pressure, political considerations, public clamour, loyalty to a Party or fear of criticism.
- 2. A member shall not, directly or indirectly, incur any obligation or accept any benefit that would in any way interfere, or appear to interfere, with the proper performance of her or his duties.
- 3. A member shall not use her or his position on the arbitration panel to advance any personal or private interests and shall avoid actions that may create the impression that others are in a special position to influence her or him.
- 4. A member shall not allow financial, business, professional, family or social relationships or responsibilities to influence her or his conduct or judgment.
- 5. A member shall avoid entering into any relationship or acquiring any financial interest that is likely to affect her or his impartiality or that might reasonably create an appearance of impropriety or bias.

Article 6 Obligations of former members

All former members shall avoid actions that may create the appearance that they were biased in carrying out their duties or derived advantage from the decision or ruling of the arbitration panel.

Article 7 Confidentiality

- 1. No member or former member shall at any time disclose or use any non-public information concerning a proceeding or acquired during a proceeding except for the purposes of that proceeding and shall not, in any case, disclose or use any such information to gain personal advantage or advantage for others or to adversely affect the interest of others.
- 2. A member shall not disclose an arbitration panel ruling or parts thereof prior to its publication in accordance with the Agreement.
- 3. A member or former member shall not at any time disclose the deliberations of an arbitration panel, or any member's view.

Article 8 Expenses

Each member shall keep a record and render a final account of the time devoted to the procedure and the expenses incurred.

Article 9 Mediators

The disciplines described in this Code of Conduct as applying to members or former members shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to mediators.

TITLE I

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 1

Definitions

For the purposes of this Protocol:

- (a) 'manufacture' means any kind of working or processing including assembly or specific operations;
- (b) 'material' means any ingredient, raw material, component or part used in the manufacture of the product;
- (c) 'product' means the product being manufactured, even if it is intended for later use in another manufacturing operation;
- (d) 'goods' means both materials and products;
- (e) 'customs value' means the value as determined in accordance with the 1994 Agreement on implementation of Article VII of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (WTO Agreement on customs valuation);
- (f) 'ex-works price' means the price paid for the product ex works to the manufacturer in whose undertaking the last working or processing is carried out, provided the price includes the value of all the materials used, minus any internal taxes paid which are, or may be, repaid when the product obtained is exported;
- (g) 'value of materials' means the customs value at the time of importation of the non-originating materials used, or, if this is not known and cannot be ascertained, the first ascertainable price paid for the materials in the territory concerned;
- (h) 'value of originating materials' means the value of such materials as defined in subparagraph (g) applied mutatis mutandis;
- (i) 'added value' shall be taken to be the ex-works price minus the customs value of third country materials imported into the United Kingdom, the CARIFORUM States or the Overseas Countries and Territories ('OCTs');
- (j) 'chapters' and 'headings' mean the chapters and the four- digit headings used in the nomenclature which makes up the Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System, referred to in this Protocol as 'the Harmonised System' or 'HS';
- (k) 'classified' refers to the classification of a product or material under a particular heading;
- (l) 'consignment' means products which are either sent simultaneously from one exporter to one

consignee or covered by a single transport document covering their shipment from the exporter to the consignee or, in the absence of such a document, by a single invoice;

- (m) 'territories' includes territorial waters;
- (n) 'OCTs' means the Overseas Countries and Territories as defined in Annex IX;
- (o) 'other ACP States' means the countries listed in Annex XI.
- (p) 'EU' means the European Union.

TITLE II

DEFINITION OF THE CONCEPT OF 'ORIGINATING PRODUCTS'

Article 2

General requirements

1. For the purpose of 'the Agreement', the following products shall be considered as originating in the United Kingdom:

- (a) products wholly obtained in the United Kingdom within the meaning of Article 6 of this Protocol;
- (b) products obtained in the United Kingdom incorporating materials which have not been wholly obtained there, provided that such materials have undergone sufficient working or processing in the United Kingdom within the meaning of Article 7.

2. For the purpose of the Agreement, the following products shall be considered as originating in the CARIFORUM States:

- (a) products wholly obtained in the CARIFORUM States within the meaning of Article 6 of this Protocol;
- (b) products obtained in CARIFORUM States incorporating materials which have not been wholly obtained there, provided that such materials have undergone sufficient working or processing in that CARIFORUM State within the meaning of Article 7.

3. For the purpose of implementing paragraph 2, the territories of the CARIFORUM States shall be considered as being one territory.

Originating products made up of materials wholly obtained or sufficiently worked or processed in two or more CARIFORUM States shall be considered as products originating in the CARIFORUM State where the last working or processing took place, provided the working or processing carried out there goes beyond that referred to in Article 8 of this Protocol.

Cumulation in the United Kingdom

1. For the purpose of Article 2(1), materials originating in the CARIFORUM States, in the EU, in the OCTs or in the other ACP States shall be considered as materials originating in the United Kingdom when incorporated into a product obtained there. It shall not be necessary that such materials have undergone sufficient working or processing, provided they have undergone working or processing going beyond that referred to in Article 8.

2. For the purpose of Article 2(1), working and processing carried out in the CARIFORUM States, in the EU, in the OCTs or in the other ACP States shall be considered as having been carried out in the United Kingdom, when the materials undergo subsequent working or processing in the United Kingdom going beyond that referred to in Article 8.

3. The cumulation provided for in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Article may only be applied with respect to the EU, OCTs and the other ACP States provided that:

- (a) the countries involved in the acquisition of the originating status and the country of destination have concluded an agreement on administrative cooperation which ensures a correct implementation of this Article;
- (b) materials and products have acquired originating status by the application of the rules of origin identical to those given in this Protocol;
- (c) the United Kingdom provides the CARIFORUM States, with details of agreements on administrative cooperation with the other countries or territories referred to in this Article. The United Kingdom and the CARIFORUM States shall publish according to their own procedures the date on which the cumulation provided for in this Article may be applied with those countries or territories listed in this Article which have fulfilled the necessary requirements.

Article 4

Cumulation in the CARIFORUM States

1. For the purpose of Article 2(2), materials originating in the United Kingdom, in the EU, in the OCTs or in the other ACP States shall be considered as materials originating in the CARIFORUM States when incorporated into a product obtained there. It shall not be necessary that such materials have undergone sufficient working or processing, provided they have undergone working or processing going beyond that referred to in Article 8.

2. For the purpose of Article 2(2), working and processing carried out in the United Kingdom, in the EU, in the OCTs or in the other ACP States shall be considered as having been carried out in the CARIFORUM States, when the materials undergo subsequent working or processing in the CARIFORUM States going beyond that referred to in Article 8.

3. The cumulation provided for in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Article may only be applied with respect to the EU, OCTs and the other ACP States provided that:

- (a) the countries involved in the acquisition of the originating status and the country of destination have concluded an agreement on administrative cooperation which ensures a correct implementation of this Article;
- (b) materials and products have acquired originating status by the application of the rules of origin identical to those given in this Protocol;
- (c) the CARIFORUM States will provide the United Kingdom with details of agreements on administrative cooperation with the other countries or territories referred to in this Article. The United Kingdom and the CARIFORUM States shall publish according to their own procedures the date on which the cumulation provided for in this article may be applied with those countries or territories listed in this Article which have fulfilled the necessary requirements.

4. Notwithstanding paragraphs 1 to 3, with regard to the products listed in Annex X and to the products of tariff heading 1006, the provisions of this Article shall apply only when the materials used in the manufacture of such products are originating in, or the working or processing is carried out in other ACPStates.

5. This Article shall not apply to products of Annex XII originating in South Africa. The cumulation provided for in this Article shall apply after 31 December 2009 for the products originating in South Africa listed in Annex XIII.

Article 5

Cumulation with neighbouring developing countries

1. At the request of the CARIFORUM States, materials originating in a neighbouring developing country listed in Annex VIII shall be considered as materials originating in a CARIFORUM State when incorporated into a product obtained there.

2. The requests shall be addressed to the Special Committee on Customs Cooperation and Trade Facilitation in accordance with Article 42.

3. It shall not be necessary that such materials have undergone sufficient working or processing, provided that:

- (a) the working or processing carried out in the CARIFORUM State exceeds the operations listed in Article 8;
- (b) the CARIFORUM States, the United Kingdom and the neighbouring developing countries concerned have concluded an agreement on adequate administrative cooperation procedures which will ensure correct implementation of this paragraph.

4. The Parties shall notify to the Special Committee on Customs Cooperation and Trade Facilitation the products to which the provisions of this Article shall not apply.

5. For the purpose of determining whether the products originate in the neighbouring developing country as defined in Annex VIII, the provisions of this Protocol shall apply.

Article 6

Wholly obtained products

1. The following shall be considered as wholly obtained in the territory of the CARIFORUM States or in the territory of the United Kingdom:

- (a) mineral products extracted from their soil or from their seabed;
- (b) fruit and vegetable products harvested there;
- (c) live animals born and raised there;
- (d) products from live animals raised there;
- (e) (i) products obtained by hunting or fishing conducted there;
 - (ii) products of aquaculture, including mariculture, where the fish are born and raised there;
- (f) products of sea fishing and other products taken from the sea outside the territorial waters of the United Kingdom or of a CARIFORUM State by their vessels;
- (g) products made aboard their factory ships exclusively from products referred to in (f);
- (h) used articles collected there fit only for the recovery of raw materials, including used tyres fit only for retreading or for use as waste;
- (i) waste and scrap resulting from manufacturing operations conducted there;
- products extracted from marine soil or subsoil outside their territorial waters provided that they have sole rights to work that soil or subsoil;
- (k) goods produced there exclusively from the products specified in (a) to (j).

2. The terms 'their vessels' and 'their factory ships' in paragraph 1(f) and (g) shall apply only to vessels and factory ships:

- (a) which are registered in the United Kingdom or in a CARIFORUM State;
- (b) which sail under the flag of the United Kingdom or of a CARIFORUM State; and
- (c) which meet one of the following conditions:
 - they are at least 50 % owned by nationals of the United Kingdom, an EU Member State or of a CARIFORUM State; or
 - (ii) they are owned by companies
 - which have their head office and their main place of business in the United Kingdom,

an EU Member State or in a CARIFORUM State; and

 which are at least 50 % owned by the United Kingdom, an EU Member State or by a CARIFORUM State, public entities or nationals of that State.

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 2, the United Kingdom shall recognise, upon request of a CARIFORUM State, that vessels chartered or leased by operators of such CARIFORUM State be treated as their vessels in order to undertake fisheries activities in its exclusive economic zone, provided that the charter or lease agreement, for which operators of the United Kingdom have been offered the right of first refusal, has been accepted by the Special Committee on Customs Cooperation and Trade Facilitation as providing adequate opportunities for developing the fishing capacity of the requesting CARIFORUM State and in particular as conferring on such CARIFORUM State the nautical and commercial responsibility for the chartered or leased vessels.

Article 7

Sufficiently worked or processed products

1. For the purposes of Article 2, products which are not wholly obtained are considered to be sufficiently worked or processed when the conditions set out in the List in Annex II are fulfilled.

2. The conditions referred to in paragraph 1 above indicate, for all products covered by the Agreement, the working or processing which must be carried out on nonoriginating materials used in manufacturing and apply only in relation to such materials. Accordingly, it follows that if a product which has acquired originating status by fulfilling the conditions set out in the List is used in the manufacture of another product, the conditions applicable to the product in which it is incorporated do not apply to it, and no account shall be taken of the non-originating materials which may have been used in its manufacture.

3. Notwithstanding paragraph 1, non-originating materials which, according to the conditions set out in Annex II, should not be used in the manufacture of a given product may nevertheless be used, provided that:

- (a) their total value does not exceed 15 % of the ex-works price of the product;
- (b) any of the percentages given in the List for the maximum value of non-originating materials are not exceeded through the application of this paragraph.
- 4. Paragraphs 1 to 3 shall apply except as provided in Article 8.

Article 8

Insufficient working or processing

1. Without prejudice to paragraph 2, the following

operations shall be considered as insufficient working or processing to confer the status of originating products, whether or not the requirements of Article 7 are satisfied:

- (a) operations to ensure the preservation of products in good condition during transport and storage;
- (b) breaking-up and assembly of packages;
- (c) washing, cleaning; removal of dust, oxide, oil, paint or other coverings;
- (d) ironing or pressing of textiles;
- (e) painting and polishing operations;
- (f) husking, partial or total bleaching, polishing, and glazing of cereals and rice;
- (g) operations to colour sugar or form sugar lumps; partial or total milling of crystal sugar (¹);
- (h) peeling, stoning and shelling, of fruits, nuts and vegetables;
- (i) sharpening, simple grinding or simple cutting;
- (j) sifting, screening, sorting, classifying, grading, matching (including the making-up of sets of articles);
- (k) simple placing in bottles, cans, flasks, bags, cases, boxes, fixing on cards or boards and all other simple packaging operations;
- (l) affixing or printing marks, labels, logos and other like distinguishing signs on products or their packaging;
- (m) simple mixing of products, whether or not of different kinds; mixing of sugar with any other material (²);
- (n) simple assembly of parts of articles to constitute a complete article or disassembly of products into parts;
- (o) a combination of two or more operations specified in (a) to (n);
- (p) slaughter of animals.

2. All operations carried out either in the United Kingdom or in the CARIFORUM States on a given product shall be considered together when determining whether the working or processing undergone by that product is to be regarded as insufficient within the meaning of paragraph 1.

Article 9

Unit of qualification

1. The unit of qualification for the application of the provisions of this Protocol shall be the particular product which is considered as the basic unit when determining classification using the nomenclature of the Harmonised System.

Accordingly, it follows that:

- (a) when a product composed of a group or assembly of articles is classified under the terms of the Harmonised System in a single heading, the whole constitutes the unit of qualification;
- (b) when a consignment consists of a number of identical products classified under the same heading of the Harmonised System, each product must be taken individually when applying the provisions of this Protocol.

2. Where, under General Rule 5 of the Harmonised System, packaging is included with the product for classification purposes, it shall be included for the purposes of determining origin.

Article 10

Accessories, spare parts and tools

Accessories, spare parts and tools dispatched with a piece of equipment, machine, apparatus or vehicle, which are part of the normal equipment and included in the price thereof or which are not separately invoiced, shall be regarded as one with the piece of equipment, machine, apparatus or vehicle in question.

Article 11

Sets

Sets, as defined in General Rule 3 of the Harmonised System, shall be regarded as originating when all component products are originating. Nevertheless, when a set is composed of originating and non-originating products, the set as a whole shall be regarded as originating, provided that the value of the non-originating products does not exceed 15 % of the ex-works price of the set.

Article 12

Neutral elements

In order to determine whether a product is originating, it shall not be necessary to determine the origin of the following which might be used in its manufacture:

- (a) energy and fuel;
- (b) plant and equipment;

¹ This is understood to mean the reduction of the size of the sugar particles as a result of grinding or milling.

² For the purpose of applying this subparagraph and in relation to Article 7 (Sufficiently worked or processed products), the Parties agree that paragraph 2 of Article 8 means that the use of one or more materials already originating in the country of manufacture implies that a processing going beyond a minimal operation has already been carried out in that country of manufacture.

- (c) machines and tools;
- (d) goods which do not enter and which are not intended to enter into the final composition of the product.

TITLE III

TERRITORIAL REQUIREMENTS

Article 13

Principle of territoriality

1. The conditions for acquiring originating status set out in Title II must be fulfilled without interruption in the CARIFORUM States or in the United Kingdom, except as provided for in Articles 3,4 and 5.

2. Where originating goods exported from the CARIFORUM States or from the United Kingdom to another country are returned, except insofar as provided for in Articles 3, 4 and 5, they must be considered as non-originating, unless it can be demonstrated to the satisfaction of the customs authorities that:

- (a) the returned goods are the same goods as those exported; and
- (b) they have not undergone any operation beyond that necessary to preserve them in good condition while in that country or while being exported.

Article 14

Direct transport

The preferential treatment provided for under the 1. Agreement applies only to products which satisfy the requirements of this Protocol and which are transported directly between the territory of the CARIFORUM States and the United Kingdom without entering any other territory. However, products constituting one single consignment may be transported through other territories with, should the occasion arise, trans-shipment or temporary warehousing in such territories, provided that they remain under the surveillance of the customs authorities in the country of transit or warehousing and do not undergo operations other than unloading, reloading or any operation designed to preserve them in good condition. Consignments that are transported through the territory of the EU with, should the occasion arise, trans-shipment or temporary warehousing in the territory of the EU, may additionally be split, stored, labelled or marked, provided they remain under the surveillance of the Customs authorities in the EU Member State of transit, transshipment or temporary warehousing so as to ensure that the products are not otherwise altered or transformed.

Originating products may be transported by pipeline across territory other than that of a CARIFORUM State, of the United Kingdom or of an OCT.

2. Evidence that the conditions set out in paragraph 1

have been fulfilled shall be supplied to the customs authorities of the importing country by the production of:

- (a) a single transport document covering the passage from the exporting country through the country of transit; or
- (b) a certificate issued by the customs authorities of the country of transit:
 - (i) giving an exact description of the products;
 - stating the dates of unloading and reloading of the products and, where applicable, the names of the ships, or the other means of transport used;
 - (iii) stating the scope of and reason for any splitting, labelling and marking activities conducted;

and

- (iv) certifying the conditions under which the products remained in the transit country, including any temporary storage; or
- (c) failing these, any substantiating documents.

Article 15

Exhibitions

1. Originating products, sent from a CARIFORUM State or from the United Kingdom for exhibition in a country or territory other than those referred to in Articles 3, 4 and 5 and sold after the exhibition for importation into the United Kingdom or a CARIFORUM State shall benefit on importation from the provisions of the Agreement provided it is shown to the satisfaction of the customs authorities that:

- (a) an exporter has consigned these products from a CARIFORUM State or the United Kingdom to the country in which the exhibition is held and has exhibited them there;
- (b) the products have been sold or otherwise disposed of by that exporter to a person in a CARIFORUM State or in the United Kingdom;
- (c) the products have been consigned during the exhibition or immediately thereafter in the state in which they were sent for exhibition;

and

(d) the products have not, since they were consigned for exhibition, been used for any purpose other than demonstration at the exhibition.

2. A proof of origin must be issued or made out in accordance with the provisions of Title IV and submitted to

the customs authorities of the importing country in the normal manner. The name and address of the exhibition must be indicated thereon. Where necessary, additional documentary evidence of the conditions under which they have been exhibited may be required.

3. Paragraph 1 shall apply to any trade, industrial, agricultural or crafts exhibition, fair or similar public show or display which is not organised for private purposes in shops or business premises with a view to the sale of foreign products, and during which the products remain under customs control.

TITLE IV

PROOF OF ORIGIN

Article 16

General requirements

1. Products originating in a CARIFORUM State shall, on importation into the United Kingdom and products originating in the United Kingdom shall, on importation into a CARIFORUM State, benefit from the provisions of the Agreement upon submission of either:

- (a) a movement certificate EUR.1, a specimen of which appears in Annex III; or
- (b) in the cases specified in Article 21(1), a declaration, subsequently referred to as the invoice declaration, given by the exporter on an invoice, a delivery note or any other commercial document which describes the products concerned in sufficient detail to enable them to be identified; the text of the invoice declaration appears in Annex IV.

2. Notwithstanding paragraph 1, originating products within the meaning of this Protocol shall, in the cases specified in Article 26, benefit from the Agreement without it being necessary to submit any of the documents referred to above.

3. For the purpose of applying the provisions of this Title, the exporters shall endeavour to use a language common to both the CARIFORUM States and the United Kingdom.

Article 17

Procedure for the issue of a movement certificate EUR.1

1. A movement certificate EUR.1 shall be issued by the customs authorities of the exporting country on application having been made in writing by the exporter or, under the exporter's responsibility, by his authorised representative.

2. For this purpose, the exporter or his authorised representative shall fill out both the movement certificate EUR.1 and the application form, specimens of which appear in Annex III. These forms shall be completed in accordance with the provisions of this Protocol. If they are handwritten, they shall be completed in ink in printed characters. The description of the products must be given in the box reserved for this purpose without leaving any blank lines. Where the box is not completely filled, a horizontal line must be drawn below the last line of the description, the empty space being crossed through.

3. The exporter applying for the issue of a movement certificate EUR.1 shall be prepared to submit at any time, at the request of the customs authorities of the exporting country where the movement certificate EUR.1 is issued, all appropriate documents proving the originating status of the products concerned as well as the fulfilment of the other requirements of this Protocol.

4. A movement certificate EUR.1 shall be issued by the customs authorities of the United Kingdom or of a CARIFORUM State if the products concerned can be considered as products originating in the United Kingdom or in a CARIFORUM State or in one of the other countries or territories referred to in Articles 3, 4 and 5 and fulfil the other requirements of this Protocol.

5. The issuing customs authorities shall take any steps necessary to verify the originating status of the products and the fulfilment of the other requirements of this Protocol. For this purpose, they shall have the right to call for any evidence and to carry out any inspection of the exporter's accounts or any other check considered appropriate. The issuing customs authorities shall also ensure that the forms referred to in paragraph 2 are duly completed. In particular, they shall check whether the space reserved for the description of the products has been completed in such a manner as to exclude all possibility of fraudulent additions.

6. The date of issue of the movement certificate EUR.1 shall be indicated in Box 11 of the certificate.

7. A movement certificate EUR.1 shall be issued by the customs authorities and made available to the exporter as soon as actual exportation has been effected or ensured.

Article 18

Movement certificates EUR.1 issued retrospectively

1. Notwithstanding Article 17(7), a movement certificate EUR.1 may exceptionally be issued after exportation of the products to which it relates if:

- (a) it was not issued at the time of exportation because of errors or involuntary omissions or special circumstances; or
- (b) it is demonstrated to the satisfaction of the customs authorities that a movement certificate EUR.1 was issued but was not accepted at importation for technical reasons.

2. For the implementation of paragraph 1, the exporter must indicate in his application the place and date of exportation of the products to which the movement certificate EUR.1 relates, and state the reasons for his request.

3. The customs authorities may issue a movement certificate EUR.1 retrospectively only after verifying that the information supplied in the exporter's application agrees with that in the corresponding file.

4. Movement certificates EUR.1 issued retrospectively must be endorsed with the following phrase in English: 'ISSUED RETROSPECTIVELY'

5. The endorsement referred to in paragraph 4 shall be inserted in the 'Remarks' box of the movement certificate EUR.1.

Article 19

Issue of a duplicate movement certificate EUR.1

- 1. In the event of theft, loss or destruction of a movement certificate EUR.1, the exporter may apply to the customs authorities which issued it for a duplicate made out on the basis of the export documents in their possession.
- 2. The duplicate issued in this way must be endorsed with the following word in English:

'DUPLICATE'

- 3. The endorsement referred to in paragraph 2 shall be inserted in the 'Remarks' box of the duplicate movement certificate EUR.1.
- 4. The duplicate, which must bear the date of issue of the original movement certificate EUR.1, shall take effect as from that date.

Article 20

Issue of movement certificates EUR.1 on the basis of a proof of origin issued or made out previously

When originating products are placed under the control of a customs office in a CARIFORUM State or in the United Kingdom, it shall be possible to replace the original proof of origin by one or more movement certificates EUR.1 for the purpose of sending all or some of these products elsewhere within the CARIFORUM States or within the United Kingdom. The replacement movement certificate(s) EUR.1 shall be issued by the customs office under whose control the products are placed.

Article 21

Conditions for making out an invoice declaration

1. An invoice declaration as referred to in Article 16(1)(b) may be made out:

- (a) by an approved exporter within the meaning of Article 22; or
- (b) by any exporter for any consignment consisting of one or more packages containing originating products whose total value does not exceed EUR 6 000.

2. An invoice declaration may be made out if the products concerned can be considered as products originating in the CARIFORUM States or in the United Kingdom and fulfil the other requirements of this Protocol.

3. The exporter making out an invoice declaration shall be prepared to submit at any time, at the request of the customs authorities of the exporting country, all appropriate documents proving the originating status of the products concerned as well as the fulfilment of the other requirements of this Protocol.

4. An invoice declaration shall be made out by the exporter by typing, stamping or printing on the invoice, the delivery note or another commercial document, the declaration, the text of which appears in Annex IV to this Protocol, using one of the linguistic versions set out in that Annex and in accordance with the provisions of the domestic law of the exporting country. If the declaration is handwritten, it shall be written in ink in printed characters.

5. Invoice declarations shall bear the original signature of the exporter in manuscript. However, an approved exporter within the meaning of Article 22 shall not be required to sign such declarations provided that he gives the customs authorities of the exporting country a written undertaking that he accepts full responsibility for any invoice declaration which identifies him as if it had been signed in manuscript by him.

6. An invoice declaration may be made out by the exporter when the products to which it relates are exported, or after exportation on condition that it is presented in the importing country no longer than two years after the importation of the products to which it relates.

Article 22

Approved exporter

1. The customs authorities of the exporting country may authorise any exporter who makes frequent shipments of products under the trade cooperation provisions of the Agreement to make out invoice declarations irrespective of the value of the products concerned. An exporter seeking such authorisation must offer to the satisfaction of the customs authorities all guarantees necessary to verify the originating status of the products as well as the fulfilment of the other requirements of this Protocol.

2. The customs authorities may grant the status of approved exporter subject to any conditions which they consider appropriate.

3. The customs authorities shall grant to the approved exporter a customs authorisation number which shall appear on the invoice declaration.

4. The customs authorities shall monitor the use of the authorisation by the approved exporter.

5. The customs authorities may withdraw the authorisation at any time. They shall do so where the approved exporter no longer offers the guarantees referred to in paragraph 1, does not fulfil the conditions referred to in paragraph 2 or otherwise makes an incorrect use of the authorisation.

Article 23

Validity of proof of origin

1. A proof of origin shall be valid for ten months from the date of issue in the exporting country, and must be submitted within the said period to the customs authorities of the importing country.

2. Proof of origin which are submitted to the customs authorities of the importing country after the final date for presentation specified in paragraph 1 may be accepted for the purpose of applying preferential treatment, where the failure to submit these documents by the final date set is due to exceptional circumstances.

3. In other cases of belated presentation, the customs authorities of the importing country may accept the proofs of origin where the products have been submitted before the said final date.

Article 24

Submission of proof of origin

Proof of origin shall be submitted to the customs authorities of the importing country in accordance with the procedures applicable in that country. The said authorities may require a translation of a proof of origin and may also require the import declaration to be accompanied by a statement from the importer to the effect that the products meet the conditions required for the implementation of the Agreement.

Article 25

Importation by instalments

Where, at the request of the importer and on the conditions laid down by the customs authorities of the importing country, dismantled or non-assembled products within the meaning of General Rule 2(a) of the Harmonised System falling within Sections XVI and XVII or heading 7 308 and 9 406 of the Harmonised System are imported by instalments, a single proof of origin for such products shall be submitted to the customs authorities upon importation of the first instalment.

Article 26

Exemptions from proof of origin

1. Products sent as small packages from private persons to private persons or forming part of travellers' personal luggage shall be admitted as originating products without requiring the submission of a proof of origin, provided that such products are not imported by way of trade and have been declared as meeting the requirements of this Protocol and where there is no doubt as to the veracity of such a declaration. In the case of products sent by post, this declaration can be made on customs declaration CN22/CN23 or on a sheet of paper annexed to that document.

2. Imports which are occasional and consist solely of products for the personal use of the recipients or travellers or their families shall not be considered as imports by way of trade if it is evident from the nature and quantity of the products that no commercial purpose is in view.

3. Furthermore, the total value of these products shall not exceed EUR 500 in the case of small packages or EUR 1 200 in the case of products forming part of travellers' personal luggage.

Article 27

Information procedure for cumulation purposes

1. When Articles 2(3), 3(1) and 4(1) are applied, the evidence of originating status within the meaning of this Protocol of the materials coming from a CARIFORUM State, from the United Kingdom, from the EU, from another ACP State or from an OCT shall be given by a movement certificate EUR 1 or by the supplier's declaration, a specimen of which appears in Annex V A to this Protocol, given by the exporter in the State or in the United Kingdom from which the materials came.

2. When Articles 2(3), 3(2) and 4(2) are applied, the evidence of the working or processing carried out in a CARIFORUM State, in the United Kingdom, in the EU, in another ACP State or in an OCT shall be given by the supplier's declaration, a specimen of which appears in Annex V A and Annex V B to this Protocol, given by the exporter in the State or in the United Kingdom from which the materials came.

3. A separate supplier's declaration shall be made up by the supplier for each consignment of material on the commercial invoice related to that shipment or in an annex to that invoice, or on a delivery note or other commercial document related to that shipment which describes the materials concerned in sufficient detail to enable them to be identified.

4. The supplier's declaration may be made out on a preprinted form.

5. The suppliers' declarations shall bear the original signature of the supplier in manuscript. However, where the invoice and the supplier's declaration are established using electronic data- processing methods, the supplier's declaration need not be signed in manuscript provided the responsible official in the supplying company is identified to the satisfaction of the customs authorities in the State where the suppliers' declarations are established. The said customs authorities may lay down conditions for the

implementation of this paragraph.

6. The supplier's declarations shall be submitted to the customs authorities in the exporting country requested to issue the movement certificate EUR 1.

7. The supplier making out a declaration must be prepared to submit at any time, at the request of the customs authorities of the country where the declaration is made out, all appropriate documents proving that the information given on this declaration is correct.

8. Suppliers' declarations made and information certificates issued before the entry into force of this Agreement shall, in accordance with Article 27 of Protocol I to the CARIFORUM-EU EPA and for the duration of their validity, be accepted by the Parties for the purposes of applying preferential treatment under this Agreement.

Article 28

Supporting documents

The documents referred to in Articles 17(3) and 21(3) used for the purpose of proving that products covered by a movement certificate EUR.1 or an invoice declaration can be considered as products originating in a CARIFORUM State, in the United Kingdom or in one of the other countries or territories referred to in Articles 3, 4 and 5 and fulfil the other requirements of this Protocol may consist *inter alia* of the following:

- (a) direct evidence of the processes carried out by the exporter or supplier to obtain the goods concerned, contained for example in his accounts or internal bookkeeping;
- (b) documents proving the originating status of materials used, issued or made out in a CARIFORUM State, in the United Kingdom or in one of the other countries or territories referred to in Articles 3, 4 and 5 where these documents are used in accordance with domestic law;
- (c) documents proving the working or processing of materials in the CARIFORUM States, in the United Kingdom or in one of the other countries or territories referred to in Articles 3 and 4 issued or made out in a CARIFORUM State, in the United Kingdom or in one of the other countries or territories referred to in Articles 3 and 4 where these documents are used in accordance with domestic law;
- (d) movement certificates EUR.1 or invoice declarations proving the originating status of materials used, issued or made out in the CARIFORUM States, in the United Kingdom or in one of the other countries or territories referred to in Articles 3, 4 and 5 and in accordance with this Protocol.

Article 29

Preservation of proof of origin and supporting documents

1. The exporter applying for the issue of a movement certificate EUR.1 shall keep for at least three years the documents referred to in Article 17(3).

2. The exporter making out an invoice declaration shall keep for at least three years a copy of this invoice declaration as well as the documents referred to in Article 21(3).

3. The supplier making out a supplier's declaration shall keep for at least three years copies of the declaration and of the invoice, delivery notes or other commercial document to which this declaration is annexed as well as the documents referred to in Article 27(7).

4. The customs authorities of the exporting country issuing a movement certificate EUR.1 shall keep for at least three years the application form referred to in Article 17(2).

5. The customs authorities of the importing country shall keep for at least three years the movement certificates EUR.1 and the invoice declarations submitted to them.

Article 30

Discrepancies and formal errors

1. The discovery of slight discrepancies between the statements made in the proof of origin and those made in the documents submitted to the customs office for the purpose of carrying out the formalities for importing the products shall not ipso facto render the proof of origin null and void if it is duly established that this document does correspond to the products submitted.

2. Obvious formal errors such as typing errors on a proof of origin should not cause this document to be rejected if these errors are not such as to create doubts concerning the correctness of the statements made in this document.

TITLE V

ARRANGEMENTS FOR ADMINISTRATIVE COOPERATION

Article 31

Administrative conditions for products to benefit from the Agreement

Products originating within the meaning of this Protocol in the CARIFORUM States or in the United Kingdom shall benefit from the preferences resulting from the Agreement only on condition that the necessary arrangements, structures and systems required for the implementation and enforcement of the rules and procedures laid down in this Protocol are in place.

Article 32

Notification of information related to customs authorities

1. The CARIFORUM States and the United Kingdom shall provide each other with the addresses of the customs authorities responsible for issuing and verifying of movement certificates EUR.1 and invoice declarations or supplier's declarations, and with specimen impressions of the stamps used in their customs offices for the issue of these certificates.

Movement certificates EUR.1 and invoice declarations or supplier's declarations shall be accepted for the purpose of applying preferential treatment from the date the information is received by the United Kingdom.

2. The CARIFORUM States and the United Kingdom shall inform each other immediately whenever there are any changes to the information referred to in paragraph 1.

Article 33

Mutual assistance

In order to ensure the proper application of this Protocol, the United Kingdom, the CARIFORUM States and the other countries referred to in Articles 3, 4 and 5 shall assist each other, through the competent customs administrations, in checking the authenticity of the movement certificates EUR.1, the invoice declarations or the supplier's declarations and the correctness of the information given in these documents.

The authorities consulted shall furnish the relevant information concerning the conditions under which the product has been made, indicating especially the conditions in which the rules of origin have been respected in the various CARIFORUM States, the United Kingdom and other countries referred to in Articles 3, 4 and 5 concerned.

Article 34

Verification of proof of origin

1. Subsequent verifications of proof of origin shall be carried out at random or based on risk analysis or whenever the customs authorities of the importing country have reasonable doubts as to the authenticity of such documents, the originating status of the products concerned or the fulfilment of the other requirements of this Protocol.

2. For the purposes of implementing the provisions of paragraph 1, the customs authorities of the importing country shall return the movement certificate EUR.1 and the invoice, if it has been submitted, the invoice declaration, or a copy of these documents, to the customs authorities of the exporting country giving, where appropriate, the reasons for the request for verification. Any documents and information obtained suggesting that

the information given on the proof of origin is incorrect shall be forwarded in support of the request for verification.

The verification shall be carried out by the customs authorities of the exporting country. For this purpose, they shall have the right to call for any evidence and to carry out any inspection of the exporter's accounts or any other check considered appropriate.

3. If the customs authorities of the importing country decide to suspend the granting of preferential treatment to the products concerned while awaiting the results of the verification, release of the products shall be offered to the importer subject to any precautionary measures judged necessary.

4. The customs authorities requesting the verification shall be informed of the results of this verification as soon as possible. These results must indicate clearly whether the documents are authentic and whether the products concerned can be considered as products originating in a CARIFORUM State, in the United Kingdom or in one of the other countries referred to in Article 3, 4 and 5 and fulfil the other requirements of this Protocol.

5. If in cases of reasonable doubt there is no reply within ten months of the date of the verification request or if the reply does not contain sufficient information to determine the authenticity of the document in question or the real origin of the products, the requesting customs authorities shall, except in exceptional circumstances, refuse entitlement to the preferences.

6. Where the verification procedure or any other available information appears to indicate that the provisions of this Protocol are being contravened, the exporting country on its own initiative or at the request of the importing country shall carry out appropriate enquires or arrange for such enquiries to be carried out with due urgency to identify and prevent such contraventions and for this purpose the exporting country concerned may invite the participation of the importing country in these enquiries.

Article 35

Verification of suppliers' declarations

1. Verification of suppliers' declarations shall be carried out at random or based on risk analysis or whenever the customs authorities of the importing State have reasonable doubt as to the authenticity of the document or the accuracy or complete- ness of the information concerning the true origin of the materials in question.

2. The customs authorities to which a supplier's declaration is submitted may request the customs authorities of the State where the declaration was made to issue an information certificate, a specimen of which appears in Annex VI to this Protocol. Alternatively, the customs authorities to which a supplier's declaration is submitted may request the exporter to produce an information certificate issued by the customs authorities of the State where the declaration was made.

A copy of the information certificate shall be preserved by the office which has issued it for at least three years. 3. The customs authorities requesting the verification shall be informed of the results thereof as soon as possible. The results must indicate clearly whether the information given in the supplier's declaration is correct and make it possible for the customs authorities to determine whether and to what extent this supplier's declaration could be taken into account for issuing a movement certificate EUR.1 or for making out an invoice declaration.

4. The verification shall be carried out by the customs authorities of the country where the supplier's declaration was made out. For this purpose, they shall have the right to call for any evidence or to carry out any inspection of the supplier's account or any other check which they consider appropriate in order to verify the correctness of any supplier's declaration.

5. Any movement certificate EUR.1 or invoice declaration issued or made out on the basis of an incorrect supplier's declaration shall be considered null and void.

Article 36

Dispute settlement

Where disputes arise in relation to the verification procedures of Articles 34 and 35 which cannot be settled between the customs authorities requesting a verification and the customs authorities responsible for carrying out this verification or where they raise a question as to the interpretation of this Protocol, they shall be submitted to the Special Committee on Customs Cooperation and Trade Facilitation.

In all cases the settlement of disputes between the importer and the customs authorities of the importing country shall take place under the legislation of that country.

Article 37

Penalties

Penalties shall be imposed on any person who draws up, or causes to be drawn up, a document which contains incorrect information for the purpose of obtaining a preferential treatment for products.

Article 38

Free zones

1. The CARIFORUM States and the United Kingdom shall take all necessary steps to ensure that products traded under cover of a proof of origin or a supplier's declaration and which in the course of transport use a free zone situated in their territory, are not substituted by other goods and do not undergo handling other than normal operations designed to prevent their deterioration. 2. By means of an exemption to the provisions contained in paragraph 1, when originating products are imported into a free zone under cover of a proof of origin and undergo treatment or processing, the authorities concerned shall issue a new movement certificate EUR.1 at the exporter's request, if the treatment or processing undergone complies with the provisions of this Protocol.

Article 39

Derogations

1. Derogations from this Protocol may be adopted by the Special Committee on Customs Cooperation and Trade Facilitation, hereafter in this Article referred to as 'the Committee', in favour of products exported from the CARIFORUM States.

2. Derogations from this Protocol may be adopted where the development of existing industries or the creation of new industries in the CARIFORUM States justifies the adoption of such derogations.

3. The CARIFORUM State or States concerned shall, either before or when the request for derogation is submitted to the Committee, notify the United Kingdom of its request for a derogation together with the reasons for the request in accordance with paragraph 5.

4. The United Kingdom shall respond positively to all the CARIFORUM States' requests which are duly justified in conformity with this Article and which cannot cause serious injury to an established United Kingdom industry.

5. In order to facilitate the examination by the Committee of requests for derogation, the CARIFORUM State or States making the request shall, by means of the form given in Annex VII to this Protocol, furnish in support of their request the fullest possible information covering in particular the following:

- description of the finished product,
- nature and quantity of materials originating in third countries,
- nature and quantity of materials originating in CARIFORUM States or the countries or territories referred to in Articles 3 and 4, or the materials which have been processed in these countries or territories,
- manufacturing processes,
- added value achieved,
- number of employees in the enterprise concerned,
- anticipated volume of exports to the United Kingdom,
- other possible sources of supply for raw materials,
- reasons for the duration requested in the light of efforts made to find new sources of supply,
- other observations.

The Committee may modify the form.

6. The examination of requests for derogation shall in particular take into account:

- (a) the level of development or the geographical situation of the CARIFORUM State or States concerned;
- (b) cases where the application of the existing rules of origin would significantly affect the ability of an existing industry in a CARIFORUM State or States to continue their exports to the United Kingdom, with particular reference to cases where this could lead to cessation of its activities;
- (c) specific cases where it can be clearly demonstrated that significant investment in an industry could be deterred by the rules of origin and where a derogation favouring the realisation of the investment programme would enable these rules to be satisfied by stages.

7. In every case an examination shall be made to ascertain whether the rules relating to cumulation of origin do not provide a solution to the problem.

8. The Committee shall take steps necessary to ensure that a decision on a request for derogation is reached as soon as possible and, in any case, not later than seventy-five working days after the request is received by the United Kingdom. If the United Kingdom does not inform the CARIFORUM State of its position on the request within this period, the request shall be deemed to have been accepted.

- 9. (a) The derogation shall be valid for a period, generally of five years, to be determined by the Committee.
 - (b) The derogation decision may provide for renewals without a new decision of the Committee being necessary, provided that the CARIFORUM State or States concerned submit, three months before the end of each period, proof that they are still unable to meet the conditions of this Protocol which have been derogated from.

If any objection is made to the extension, the Committee shall examine it as soon as possible and decide whether to prolong the derogation. The Committee shall proceed as provided for in paragraph 8. All necessary measures shall be taken to avoid interruptions in the application of the derogation.

(c) In the periods referred to in subparagraphs (a) and (b), the Committee may review the terms for implementing the derogation should a significant change be found to have taken place in the substantive factors governing the decision to grant the derogation. On conclusion of its review the Committee may decide to amend the terms of its decision as regards the scope of derogation or any other condition previously laid down.

TITLE VI

CEUTA AND MELILLA

Article 40

Special conditions

The term 'EU' used in this Protocol does not cover Ceuta and Melilla. Products originating in Ceuta and Melilla are not considered to be products originating in the EU for the purposes of this Protocol.

TITLE VII

FINAL PROVISIONS

Article 41

Amendment of the Protocol

The Joint CARIFORUM-UK Council may decide to amend the provisions of this Protocol.

Article 42

Tasks of the Special Committee on Customs Cooperation and Trade Facilitation

In accordance with the provisions of Article 36 of the Agreement, the Special Committee on Customs Cooperation and Trade Facilitation shall:

- (a) take decisions on cumulation under the conditions laid down in Article 5;
- (b) take decisions on derogations from this Protocol under the conditions laid down in Article 39;
- (c) monitor the implementation and the administration of the provisions of this Protocol.

Article 43

Review

The Parties shall review the provisions of paragraph 4 of Article 4 after three years from the signature of the Agreement with a view to reducing the products listed in Annex X to this Protocol.

Article 44

Annexes

The Annexes to this Protocol shall form an integral part thereof.

ANNEX I to Protocol I

Introductory notes to the list in Annex II (¹)

Note 1:

The list sets out the conditions required for all products to be considered as sufficiently worked or processed within the meaning of Article 7 of the Protocol.

Note 2:

- 1. The first two columns in the list describe the product obtained. The first column gives the heading number or chapter number used in the Harmonised System and the second column gives the description of goods used in that system for that heading or chapter. For each entry in the first two columns a rule is specified in columns 3 or 4. Where, in some cases, the entry in the first column is preceded by an 'ex', this signifies that the rules in columns 3 or 4 apply only to the part of that heading as described in column 2.
- 2. Where several heading numbers are grouped together in column 1 or a chapter number is given and the description of products in column 2 is therefore given in general terms, the adjacent rules in columns 3 or 4 apply to all products which, under the Harmonised System, are classified in headings of the chapter or in any of the headings grouped together in column 1.
- 3. Where there are different rules in the list applying to different products within a heading, each indent contains the description of that part of the heading covered by the adjacent rules in columns 3 or 4.
- 4. Where, for an entry in the first two columns, a rule is specified in both columns 3 and 4, the exporter may opt, as an alternative, to apply either the rule set out in column 3 or that set out in column 4. If no origin rule is given in column 4, the rule set out in column 3 has to be applied.

Note 3:

1. The provisions of Article 7 of the Protocol concerning products having acquired originating status which are used in the manufacture of other products apply regardless of whether this status has been acquired inside the factory where these products are used or in another factory in the United Kingdom or in the CARIFORUM States.

Example:

An engine of heading No 8407, for which the rule states that the value of the nonoriginating materials which may be incorporated may not exceed 40 % of the exworks price, is made from other alloy steel roughly shaped by forging of heading No ex 7224.

If this forging has been forged in the United Kingdom from a non-originating ingot, it has already acquired originating status by virtue of the rule for heading No ex 7224 in the list. The forging can then count as originating in the value calculation for the engine regardless of whether it was produced in the same factory or in another factory in the United Kingdom. The value of the non-originating ingot is thus not taken into account when adding up the value of the non-originating materials used.

- 2. The rule in the list represents the minimum amount of working or processing required and the carrying out of more working or processing also confers originating status; conversely, the carrying out of less working or processing cannot confer originating status. Therefore, if a rule provides that non-originating material at a certain level of manufacture may be used, the use of such material at an earlier stage of manufacture is allowed and the use of such material at a later stage is not.
- 3. Without prejudice to Note 3.2 where a rule states that 'materials of any heading'

may be used, materials of the same heading as the product may also be used, subject, however, to any specific limitations which may also be contained in the rule. However, the expression 'manufacture from materials of any heading, including other materials of heading No ...' means that only materials classified in the same heading as the product of a different description than that of the product as given in column 2 of the list may be used.

4. When a rule in the list specifies that a product may be manufactured from more than one material, this means that any one or more materials may be used. It does not require that all be used.

Example:

The rule for fabrics of heading Nos 5208 to 5212 provides that natural fibres may be used and that chemical materials, among other materials, may also be used. This does not mean that both have to be used; it is possible to use one or the other or both.

5. Where a rule in the list specifies that a product must be manufactured from a particular material, the condition obviously does not prevent the use of other materials which, because of their inherent nature, cannot satisfy the rule. (See also Note 6.3 below in relation to textiles).

Example:

The rule for prepared foods of heading No 1904 which specifically excludes the use of cereals and their derivatives does not prevent the use of mineral salts, chemicals and other additives which are not products from cereals.

However, this does not apply to products which, although they cannot be manufactured from the particular materials specified in the list, can be produced from a material of the same nature at an earlier stage of manufacture.

Example:

In the case of an article of apparel of ex Chapter 62 made from non-woven materials, if the use of only non- originating yarn is allowed for this class of article, it is not possible to start from non-woven cloth — even if non- woven cloth cannot normally be made from yarn. In such cases, the starting material would normally be at the stage before yarn — that is the fibre stage.

6. Where, in a rule in the list, two percentages are given for the maximum value of non-originating materials that can be used, then these percentages may not be added together. In other words, the maximum value of all the non-originating materials used may never exceed the highest of the percentages given. Furthermore, the individual percentages must not be exceeded in relation to the particular materials they apply to.

Note 4:

- 1. The term 'natural fibres' is used in the list to refer to fibres other than artificial or synthetic fibres. It is restricted to the stages before spinning takes place, including waste, and, unless otherwise specified, includes fibres that have been carded, combed or otherwise processed but not spun.
- 2. The term natural fibres includes horsehair of heading No 0503, silk of heading Nos 5002 and 5003 as well as the wool fibres, fine or coarse animal hair of heading Nos 5101 to 5105, the cotton fibres of heading Nos 5201 to 5203 and the other vegetable fibres of heading Nos 5301 to 5305.
- 3. The terms 'textile pulp', 'chemical materials' and 'paper-making materials' are used in the list to describe the materials not classified in Chapters 50 to 63, which can be used to manufacture artificial, synthetic or paper fibres or yarns.
- 4. The term 'man-made staple fibres' is used in the list to refer to synthetic or artificial filament tow, staple fibres or waste, of heading Nos 5501 to 5507.

Note 5:

1. Where for a given product in the list a reference is made to this note, the

conditions set out in column 3 shall not be applied to any basic textile materials, used in the manufacture of this product, which, taken together, represent 10% or less of the total weight of all the basic textile materials used. (See also Notes 5.3 and 5.4 below).

2. However, the tolerance mentioned in Note 5.1 may only be applied to mixed products which have been made from two or more basic textile materials.

The following are the basic textile materials:

- I. silk
- II. wool
- III. coarse animal hair
- IV. fine animal hair
- V. horsehair
- VI. cotton
- VII. paper-making materials and paper
- VIII. flax
- IX. true hemp
- X. jute and other textile bast fibres
- XI. sisal and other textile fibres of the genus Agave
- XII. coconut, abaca, ramie and other vegetable textile fibres
- XIII. synthetic man-made filaments
- XIV. artificial man-made filaments
- XV. current conducting filaments
- XVI. synthetic man-made staple fibres of polypropylene
- XVII. synthetic man-made staple fibres of polyester
- XVIII. synthetic man-made staple fibres of polyamide
- XIX. synthetic man-made staple fibres of polyacrylonitrile
- XX. synthetic man-made staple fibres of polyimide
- XXI. synthetic man-made staple fibres of polytetrafluoroethylene
- XXII. synthetic man-made staple fibres of polyphenylene sulphide
- XXIII. synthetic man-made staple fibres of polyvinyl chloride
- XXIV. other synthetic man-made staple fibres
- XXV. artificial man-made staple fibres of viscose
- XXVI. other artificial man-made staple fibres
- XXVII. yarn made of polyurethane segmented with flexible segments of polyether whether or not gimped
- XXVIII. yarn made of polyurethane segmented with flexible segments of polyester whether or

not gimped

- XXIX. products of heading No 5605 (metallised yarn) incorporating strip consisting of a core of aluminium foil or of a core of plastic film whether or not coated with aluminium powder, of a width not exceeding 5 mm, sandwiched by means of a transparent or coloured adhesive between two layers of plastic film
- XXX. other products of heading No 5605.

Example:

A yarn of heading No 5205 made from cotton fibres of heading No 5203 and synthetic staple fibres of heading No 5506 is a mixed yarn. Therefore, non-originating synthetic staple fibres that do not satisfy the origin rules (which require manufacture from chemical materials or textile pulp) may be used up to a weight of 10 % of the yarn.

Example:

A woollen fabric of heading No 5112 made from woollen yarn of heading No 5107 and synthetic yarn of staple fibres of heading No 5509 is a mixed fabric. Therefore synthetic yarn which does not satisfy the origin rules (which require manufacture from chemical materials or textile pulp) or woollen yarn that does not satisfy the origin rules (which require manufacture from natural fibres, not carded or combed or otherwise prepared for spinning) or a combination of the two may be used provided their total weight does not exceed 10 % of the weight of the fabric.

Example:

Tufted textile fabric of heading No 5802 made from cotton yarn of heading No 5205 and cotton fabric of heading No 5210 is only a mixed product if the cotton fabric is itself a mixed fabric being made from yarns classified in two separate headings or if the cotton yarns used are themselves mixtures.

Example:

If the tufted textile fabric concerned had been made from cotton yarn of heading No 5205 and synthetic fabric of heading No 5407, then, obviously, the yarns used are two separate basic textile materials and the tufted textile fabric is accordingly a mixed product.

- 3. In the case of products incorporating 'yarn made of polyurethane segmented with flexible segments of polyether whether or not gimped this tolerance is 20 % in respect of this yarn.
- 4. In the case of products incorporating strip consisting of a core of aluminium foil or of a core of plastic film whether or not coated with aluminium powder, of a width not exceeding 5 mm, sandwiched by means of an adhesive between two layers of plastic film, this tolerance is 30 % in respect of this strip.

Note 6:

1. In the case of those textile products, which are marked in the list by a footnote referring to this Introductory Note, textile trimmings and accessories which do not satisfy the rule set out in the list in column 3 for the made up products concerned may be used provided that their weight does not exceed 10 % of the total weight of all the textile materials incorporated.

Textile trimmings and accessories are those classified in Chapters 50 to 63. Linings and interlinings are not be regarded as trimmings or accessories.

2. Any non-textile trimmings and accessories or other materials used which

contain textiles do not have to satisfy the conditions set out in column 3 even though they fall outside the scope of Note 3.5.

3. In accordance with Note 3.5, any non-originating non-textile trimmings and accessories or other product, which do not contain any textiles, may, anyway, be used freely where they cannot be made from the materials listed in column 3.

For example, if a rule in the list says that for a particular textile item, such as a blouse, yarn must be used, this does not prevent the use of metal items, such as buttons, because they cannot be made from textile materials.

4. Where a percentage rule applies, the value of trimmings and accessories must be taken into account when calculating the value of the non-originating materials incorporated.

Note 7:

- 1. For the purposes of heading Nos ex 2707, 2713 to 2715, ex 2901, ex 2902 and ex 3403, the 'specific processes' are the following:
 - (a) vacuum distillation;
 - (b) redistillation by a very thorough fractionation process (1);
 - (c) cracking;
 - (d) reforming;
 - (e) extraction by means of selective solvents;
 - (f) the process comprising all the following operations: processing with concentrated sulphuric acid, oleum or sulphuric anhydride; neutralisation with alkaline agents; decolorisation and purification with naturally active earth, activated earth, activated charcoal or bauxite;
 - (g) polymerisation;
 - (h) alkylation;
 - (i) isomerisation.
- 2. For the purposes of heading Nos 2710, 2711 and 2712, the 'specific processes' are the following:
 - (a) vacuum distillation;
 - (b) redistillation by a very thorough fractionation process (1)
 - (c) cracking;
 - (d) reforming;
 - (e) extraction by means of selective solvents;
 - (f) the process comprising all the following operations: processing with concentrated sulphuric acid, oleum or sulphuric anhydride; neutralisation with alkaline agents; decolorisation and purification with naturally active earth, activated earth, activated charcoal or bauxite;
 - (g) polymerisation;
 - (h) alkylation;

- (i) isomerisation;
- (j) in respect of heavy oils falling within heading No ex 2710 only, desulphurisation with hydrogen resulting in a reduction of at least 85 % of the sulphur content of the products processed (ASTM D 1266-59 T method);
- (k) in respect of products falling within heading No ex 2710 only, deparaffining by a process other than filtering;
- (l) in respect of heavy oils falling within heading No ex 2710 only, treatment with hydrogen at a pressure of more than 20 bar and a temperature of more than 250 °C with the use of a catalyst, other than to effect desulphurisation, when the hydrogen constitutes an active element in a chemical reaction. The further treatment with hydrogen of lubricating oils of heading No ex 2710 (e.g. hydrofinishing or decolorisation) in order, more especially, to improve colour or stability shall not, however, be deemed to be a specific process;
- (m) in respect of fuel oils falling within heading No ex 2710 only, atmospheric distillation, on condition that less than 30 % of these products distils, by volume, including losses, at 300 $^{\circ}$ C by the ASTM D 86 method;
- (n) in respect of heavy oils other than gas oils and fuel oils falling within heading No ex 2710 only, treatment by means of a high-frequency electrical brush-discharge.

For the purposes of heading Nos ex 2707, 2713 to 2715, ex 2901, ex 2902 and ex 3403, simple operations such as cleaning, decanting, desalting, water separation, filtering, colouring, marking, obtaining a sulphur content as a result of mixing products with different sulphur contents, any combination of these operations or like operations do not confer origin.
