## REQUEST FOR INFORMATION – THE GEOGRAPHICAL CO-ORDINATES/LOCATIONS OF THE FORMER OBSERVATIONAL TOWERS IN NORTHERN IRELAND

Thank you for your e-mail dated 27 February, I can confirm that your request has been considered under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOI(A)), and the process is now complete.

You advised the following:

*"I am a final year architecture student at University College Dublin, and I am currently undertaking a thesis which concerns surveillance within landscapes.* 

## I am writing to request under the Freedom of Information Act the geographical coordinates/locations of the former Observational Towers in Northern Ireland- particularly those in South Armagh- that were erected during the Troubles."

I can confirm that the MOD does hold some of the information that you have requested however the information is exempt from disclosure under Section 21 (Information accessible to the applicant by other means). We are not required to release information if it is reasonably accessible to you in another way. Please note that Section 21 is an absolute exemption therefore it is not subject to the public interest test.

Information that falls within scope of your request is published via the Conflict, Archive on the INternet (CAIN) website. Information relating to the observational towers is produced by the Independent Monitoring Commission (IMC) and can be viewed at the following link: https://cain.ulster.ac.uk/issues/politics/docs/imc/imcreports.htm
