DEFENCE

THE LULWORTH RANGES BYELAWS 1978

Made 11 October 1978

Coming into operation 10 November 1978

The Secretary of State for Defence, in exercise of his powers under Part III of the Military Lands Act 1892 (a), Section 2 of the Military Lands Act 1900 (b), Section 7 of the Land Powers (Defence) Act 1958 (c), Section 2 of the Defence (Transfer of Functions) Act 1964 (d) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and the consent of the Crown Estate Commissioners on behalf of Her Majesty having been first had and obtained for that purpose, hereby, with the consent of the Secretary of State for Trade and the consents of the Dorset County Council and the Purbeck District Council respectively so far as regards the interference with the highways hereinafter mentioned, makes the following Byelaws:-

AREAS OF LAND AND SEA AFFECTED

1. (1) The area to which these Byelaws apply (hereinafter referred to as "the Danger Area") consists of:-
 - (a) the lands in part belonging to the Secretary of State and in part lands which the Secretary of State has a right to use for defence purposes (together with all the highways thereon) in the parishes of East Lulworth, West Lulworth, East Holme, Coombe Keynes, Steeple and Tyneham in the County of Dorset known as the Lulworth Ranges which lands are in these Byelaws referred to as the "Land Area", and
 - (b) the area of sea, tidal water and shore the limits of which are set out in the Schedule attached hereto, which area is in these Byelaws referred to as the "Sea Area".

- (2) The boundaries of the Land Area and the limits of the Sea Area are, for convenience of identification, shown by a thick black line on the plans hereto annexed and identified as "Plan of the Lulworth Ranges - Land Area" and "Plan of the Lulworth Ranges - Sea Area" respectively.

USE OF DANGER AREA

2. The Danger Area may be used for the purposes of Service training including the firing of Service weapons of all kinds, from moving vehicles or otherwise, parachute jumping, amphibious operations and for all activities ancillary to such purposes.

PROHIBITION OF ACCESS

3. (1) Subject to the provisions of Byelaw No 8 no person shall:-
- (a) enter into or upon or pass over or through, or
 - (b) be or remain in or upon, or
 - (c) cause or permit or suffer any vehicle, animal, vessel, aircraft or thing to enter into or upon or to pass through or to be or remain in or upon, or
 - (d) cause or permit any aircraft to fly at a height less than 4,572 metres (15,000 feet) above mean sea level over any part of the Danger Area at any time when entry on such part is prohibited under paragraph (2) of this Byelaw.
- (2) Entry on the Danger Area is prohibited as follows:-
- (a) the Land Area (excluding
 - (i) the roads crossing the same and the picnic sites and spaces for parking vehicles mentioned in sub-paragraph (c) hereof, and
 - (ii) the footpaths crossing the same mentioned in sub-paragraph (d) hereof)at all times;
 - (b) the Sea Area when the same is being used for any of the military purposes specified in Byelaw No 2 and notice of the fact is given by the display of the following signals, that is to say:-

- (i) a red flag by day, and a red flashing light by day and night, at St Albans Head (Latitude $50^{\circ} 34' 50''$ North, Longitude $02^{\circ} 03' 23''$ West);
- (ii) a red flag by day, and a red flashing light by day and by night, at a point on Bindon Hill (Latitude $50^{\circ} 37' 18''$ North, Longitude $02^{\circ} 13' 34''$ West);
- (c) each of the roads and picnic sites and spaces for parking vehicles mentioned in the table herein contained when the Land Area or any part thereof is being used for any of the military purposes specified in Byelaw No 2 and notice of the fact is given by the display of notices stating that the road is closed on the notice boards situated in the positions specified with regard to such roads in the following table:-

Road A

East Lulworth-West Holme Road (B3070) when travelling south to north:

Position of Notice Boards

- (i) on the West Lulworth-Wool Road at the junction with the West Lulworth-East Lulworth Road at Burngate Farm;
- (ii) on the Wool-West Lulworth Road facing the junction with the road to New Buildings nearest Coombe Keynes;
- (iii) on the Coombe Keynes-East Lulworth Road to the east of Coombe Keynes village at Kimbert's End;
- (iv) on the West Lulworth-West Holme Road at the junction of the road to Whiteway Hill;
- (v) in the village of East Lulworth on the West Lulworth-West Holme Road at the junction of the road to Coombe Keynes;
- (vi) in the village of East Lulworth on the West Lulworth-West Home Road immediately east of the Post Office;
- (vii) on the West Lulworth-West Holme Road at the junction of the by-pass road to the east of East Lulworth;

- (ii) on the Coombe Keynes-East Lulworth Road to the east of Coombe Keynes village at Kimbert's End;
- (iii) on the Wareham-Corfe Castle Road in the village of Stoborough at the junction of the road to Creech;
- (iv) on the Stoborough-Creech Road at the junction of the road to West Holme;
- (v) on the Corfe Castle-Church Knowle Road at the junction with the Corfe Castle-Wareham Road;
- (vi) on the Creech-East Lulworth Road at the junction with the road to Tyneham.

The positions specified under "Position of Notice Boards" in the table are shown by black squares on the said "Plan of the Lulworth Ranges - Land Area".

- (d) each of the footpaths identified on the said "Plan of the Lulworth Ranges - Land Area" by a broken black line and further identified on the ground by means of marker pegs and directional signs when
 - (i) notices stating that entry is prohibited are displayed on the notice boards situated at the entrance to each of the footpaths, or
 - (ii) the Land Area or any part thereof is being used for any of the Military purposes specified in Byelaw No 2 and notices stating that entry is prohibited are displayed as aforesaid.

PUBLIC USE OF THE PICNIC SITES, SPACES FOR PARKING VEHICLES AND FOOTPATHS WHEN
ACCESS THERETO IS NOT PROHIBITED

4. (1) When entry to the picnic sites and spaces for parking vehicles and footpaths mentioned in sub-paragraphs (c) and (d) respectively of Byelaw No 3(2) is not prohibited in accordance with the provisions of Byelaw No 3 the public may, subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2), (3) and (4) of this Byelaw, use the same for the purposes of open-air recreation.

- (iii) on the Corfe Castle-Church Knowle Road at the junction with the Corfe Castle-Jarsham Road;
- (iv) on the Church Knowle-Steeple Road at Barnston cross-roads west of Church Knowle village;

Road E

Wareham-Steeple Road via Creech and the picnic site for motorists and others using this road with space for parking vehicles at Steeple Triangle, when travelling north to south:

Position of Notice Boards

- (i) on the Wareham-Corfe Castle Road in the village of Stoborough at the junction of the road to Creech;
- (ii) on the Stoborough-Creech Road at the junction of the road to West Holme;
- (iii) on the Stoborough-Creech Road south of the telephone call box in Creech village;

Road F

Steeple-Wareham Road via Creech and the picnic site for motorists and others using this road with space for parking vehicles at Steeple Triangle, when travelling south to north;

Position of Notice Boards

- (i) on the Church Knowle-Steeple Road at Barnston cross-roads west of Church Knowle village;
- (ii) on the Church Knowle-Creech Road (via Creech Hill) at the junction of the road to Kimmeridge;
- (iii) on the Church Knowle-Creech Road (via Creech Hill) at the junction of the road to Steeple Church;

Road G

The road to Tyneham when travelling north to south:

Position of Notice Boards

- (i) on the Wool-West Lulworth Road facing the junction with the road to New Buildings nearest Coombe Keynes;

Road B

West Holme-East Lulworth Road (B3070) when travelling north to south:

Position of Notice Boards

- (i) on the Wareham-Wool Road east of the junction of the road to East Lulworth via West Holme;
- (ii) on the Wool-Wareham Road west of the junction of the road to East Lulworth via West Holme;
- (iii) on the Holmebridge-East Lulworth Road at West Holme cross-roads;

Road C

East Lulworth-Whiteway Hill--Povington Hill-West Creech Hill Road and the picnic site for motorists and others using this road with space for parking vehicles on Whiteway Hill, when travelling west to east;

Position of Notice Boards

- (i) on the West Lulworth-Wool Road at the junction with the West Lulworth-East Lulworth Road at Burngate Farm;
- (ii) on the Wool-West Lulworth Road facing the junction with the road to New Buildings nearest Coombe Keynes;
- (iii) on the Coombe Keynes-East Lulworth Road to the east of Coombe Keynes village at Kimbert's End;
- (iv) on the West Lulworth-West Holme Road at the junction of the road to Whiteway Hill;
- (v) in the village of East Lulworth on the West Lulworth-West Holme Road at the junction of the road to Coombe Keynes;

Road D

West Creech Hill-Povington Hill-Whiteway Hill-East Lulworth Road and the picnic site for motorists and others using this road with space for parking vehicles at Whiteway Hill, when travelling east to west:

Position of Notice Boards

- (i) on the Wareham-Corfe Castle Road in the village of Stoborough at the junction of the road to Creech;
- (ii) on the Stoborough-Creech Road at the junction of the road to West Holme;

(2) When public entry to any of the said picnic sites, spaces for parking vehicles, and footpaths is permitted under paragraph (1) of this Byelaw, no person shall ride a horse thereon, and no person shall ride, drive, propel or park a vehicle of any kind on any of the said picnic sites or footpaths.

(3) No person, when on any of the said picnic sites, spaces for parking vehicles, or footpaths, in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Byelaw shall:-

- (a) engage in or carry on any trade or business of any nature or kind whatsoever, or
- (b) loiter, or commit any nuisance, or behave in any indecent or unseemly manner, or
- (c) assemble or attempt to assemble or cause to assemble or bring thereon any number of persons for the purposes of a private or public meeting or otherwise, or address any such persons when assembled, or
- (d) camp (whether in tents, caravans or otherwise), bivouac or sleep out, or
- (e) deposit industrial or domestic refuse, rubble, waste or litter or (when on any of the said spaces for parking vehicles) abandon any vehicle or vehicle part or article, or
- (f) damage, cut or remove grass, turves or growing crops, shrubs, trees, timber or wild flower roots, fossils or articles of archaeological interest, marine organisms, or
- (g) graze any animal, or
- (h) pursue, kill, shoot, snare or trap game or other birds or animals, or take or destroy their eggs, or
- (i) damage, spoil, interfere with or remove any building, wall, fence, gate, post, cattle grid, stores, equipment or ammunition, or any stores or articles belonging to or under the care and control of the Ministry of Defence or otherwise the property of the Crown, or

- (j) do, or cause or allow to be done, any act which is likely to cause nuisance, annoyance or injury to other persons, or
- (k) deposit or distribute or cause to be deposited or distributed any hand bills, leaflets or other literature or printed matter of any description, or
- (l) affix posters, notices or bills of any description in or on the boundaries, walls or fences or in or on any buildings or other structures or on any tree, pillar, post, bollard, railing, gate, or other erection, or
- (m) light fires, drop or leave lighted or live matches or burning cigarette ends or do any act or thing liable to cause an outbreak of fire, or
- (n) take, or cause to be taken thereon any firearm, air gun, ammunition, any explosive or detonator or any part or component of the foregoing, or
- (o) fail to keep under control any dog or other animal.

- (4) (a) No person shall remain on any of the said picnic sites, spaces for parking vehicles, or footpaths after having been warned off by a person acting under the authority of the General Officer Commanding the Army District, or of the Commandant, the Gunnery School, RAC Centre, Lulworth.
- (b) No person, being the owner or person for the time being in charge of any animal or thing upon any of the said picnic sites, spaces for parking vehicles or footpaths, and no person being the owner or person for the time being in charge of any vehicle on any of the said spaces for parking vehicles, shall permit the same to remain thereon after having been warned to remove the same by a person acting under the authority of the General Officer Commanding the Army District, or of the Commandant, the Gunnery School, RAC Centre, Lulworth.

PROJECTILES

5. No person shall dig, trawl, dredge, or search for any projectile or any lead or other metal in or on the Danger Area, or interfere with or take or retain or be in possession of any projectile or any lead or other metal found within the Danger Area, or remove any projectile from the Danger Area.

OFFENCES

6. Subject to the provisions of Byelaw No 8:-

- (1) any person doing anything prohibited by or otherwise contravening any provision of any of the preceding Byelaws Nos 3, 4 and 5 thereby commits an offence against the Byelaw so contravened;
- (2) the master of every vessel shall observe and cause to be observed the said Byelaws so far as they relate to his vessel, and any master who contravenes any of the said Byelaws or who fails to cause the same to be observed thereby commits an offence against the Byelaw so contravened.

ENFORCEMENT

7. The following persons are hereby authorised to remove and take into custody without warrant any person found in or on the Danger Area in contravention of Byelaw No 3 or found committing any other offence against Byelaws Nos 3, 4 or 5, and to remove from the Danger Area any vehicle, animal, vessel, aircraft or thing found in the Danger Area in contravention of any of the said Byelaws:-

- (a) the General Officer Commanding the Army District;
- (b) the Commandant, Gunnery School, RAC Centre, Lulworth;
- (c) any officer, warrant officer, non-commissioned officer or rating of corresponding rank, or any Service policeman, in uniform and who is for the time being under the Command of the said General Officer Commanding or the Commandant, Gunnery School, RAC Centre, Lulworth;
- (d) any person authorised in writing by or on behalf of the said General Officer Commanding or the Commandant, Gunnery School, RAC Centre, Lulworth, and
- (e) any member of a police force, or any special constable under the control of the Defence Council.

EXCEPTIONS

8. (1) Nothing done by a person using the Danger Area in pursuance of Byelaw No 2 or in the course of any such private rights as are referred to in Section 15 of the Military Lands Act 1892 or by a person acting under and in accordance with any authority or permission given by or on behalf of the Secretary of State or the General Officer Commanding the Army District or the Commandant, Gunnery School, RAC Centre, Lulworth shall constitute an offence against any of these Byelaws.
- (2) If it is proved that an act or omission of any person which would otherwise have been an offence against any of the provisions of paragraph (1) or paragraph (2) of Byelaw No 3 was due to any cause not avoidable by the exercise of reasonable care by that person the act or omission shall be deemed not to be an offence by that person against that Byelaw.
- (3) The Byelaws shall not, in so far as they relate to the Sea Area, apply to:
- (a) any vessel in the ordinary course of navigation not being used for fishing in the Sea Area and remaining in the Sea Area no longer than is reasonably necessary to pass through the Sea Area;
 - (b) any vessel employed in tending, placing, replacing or removing any buoys or other aids to navigation within the Sea Area;
 - (c) any wreck-marking vessels, hoppers and vessels carrying out trials or compass adjustment;
 - (d) any vessel belonging to the Corporation of Trinity House whilst employed on any Trinity House duty or service;
 - (e) any vessel for the time being engaged in the clearance of floating oil in the Sea Area or purposes connected therewith, on behalf of the Secretary of State for Trade or of any local authority;
 - (f) any foreign vessel when outside or in innocent passage through territorial waters.

INTERPRETATION

9. (1) The Interpretation Act 1889 (e) shall apply to the interpretation of these Byelaws as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In these Byelaws the expression:-

"projectile" includes any shot or shell or other missile and any portion thereof;

"master" includes the person having command or charge of a vessel for the time being;

"vessel" includes any craft or vessel used in navigation and any craft or vessel which though not so used is for the time being waterborne;

"aircraft" includes any craft or contrivance which though not an aircraft is for the time being airborne.

DATE OF OPERATION OF BYELAWS

10. These Byelaws shall come into operation on
10 November 1978, and may be cited as the Lulworth Ranges Byelaws 1978.

THE SCHEDULE

The limits of the Sea Area are as follows:-

ON THE NORTH

Commencing at a point on the line of Mean High Water in Latitude $50^{\circ} 36' 56''$ North, Longitude $02^{\circ} 14' 22''$ West and then in a general easterly direction along the line of Mean High Water to a point in Latitude $50^{\circ} 36' 42''$ North, Longitude $02^{\circ} 08' 09''$ West; thence

ON THE EAST

From the last mentioned point in a straight line on a true bearing of 180° for a distance of 0.43 nautical miles to a point in Latitude $50^{\circ} 36' 16''$ North, Longitude $02^{\circ} 08' 09''$ West, thence in a straight line on a true bearing of $127\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ for a distance of 3.41 nautical miles to a point in Latitude $50^{\circ} 34' 12''$ North, Longitude $02^{\circ} 03' 54''$ West; thence

ON THE SOUTH

From the last mentioned point in a straight line on a true bearing of $235\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ for a distance of 1.89 nautical miles to a point in Latitude $50^{\circ} 33' 08''$ North, Longitude $02^{\circ} 06' 21''$ West, thence in a straight line on a true bearing of $247\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ for a distance of 4.03 nautical miles to a point in Latitude $50^{\circ} 31' 36''$

North, Longitude $02^{\circ} 12' 12''$ West and then in a straight line on a true bearing of $276\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ for a distance of 2.39 nautical miles to a point in Latitude $50^{\circ} 31' 5''$ North, Longitude $02^{\circ} 16' 24''$ West; thence

ON THE WEST

From the last mentioned point in a straight line on a true bearing of 003° for a distance of 3.67 nautical miles to a point in Latitude $50^{\circ} 35' 34''$ North, Longitude $02^{\circ} 16' 07''$ West and then in a straight line on a true bearing of 039° for a distance of 1.76 nautical miles to the point of commencement in Latitude $50^{\circ} 36' 56''$ North, Longitude $02^{\circ} 14' 22''$ West.

NOTICES

PENALTY FOR OFFENCES

1. By Section 17(2) of the Military Lands Act 1892, as amended by Section 22 of and Schedule 3 to the Criminal Justice Act 1967, it is provided:-

If any person commits an offence against any Byelaw under this Act, he shall be liable, on conviction before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, to a fine not exceeding TWENTY POUNDS, and may be removed by any Constable or Officer authorised in manner provided by the Byelaw from the area, whether land or water, to which the Byelaw applies, and taken into custody without Warrant, and brought before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction to be dealt with according to law, and any vehicle, animal, vessel, or thing found in the area in contravention of any Byelaw, may be removed by any Constable or such Officer as aforesaid, and on due proof of such contravention, be declared by a Court of Summary Jurisdiction to be forfeited to Her Majesty.

PRIVATE RIGHTS

2. By Section 15 of the Military Lands Act 1892, it is provided:-
Where a Secretary of State has for the time being the right of using for any military purpose any land vested in another person this part of this Act shall apply in like manner as if the land were vested in the Secretary of State and the same were appropriated for the said purpose, save that nothing therein or in any byelaws made thereunder shall injuriously affect the private rights of any person further or otherwise than is authorised by the grant of the right to use the land.

WARNING TO VESSELS IN THE SEA AREA

3. When the Sea Area is being used for live firing, safety boats will normally patrol the area in order to notify the master of any vessel that his vessel is within the Sea Area.

INSPECTION OF BYELAWS AND PLAN

RECOVERY OF PROJECTILES

5. Any person who finds a projectile within the Land Area, or within that part of the Sea Area which is for the time being uncovered by the tide, must not disturb it but should report the finding of it to the Range Officer, Gunnery School, RAC Centre, Lulworth, or to the police or to a coastguard at the first opportunity. Any person who, when trawling or dredging in the Sea Area, comes into possession of a projectile found within the Sea Area must not retain it but should immediately and without tampering with it return it in its then condition into the water and report to the Range Officer, Gunnery School, RAC Centre, Lulworth, or to the police, or to a coastguard the position where the projectile was returned into the water.

FACILITIES TO FISHERMEN

6. Fishermen who fish in the Sea Area may apply to the Commandant, Gunnery School, RAC Centre, Lulworth, for permission under Byelaw No 8(1) to fish in any part of the Sea Area when the same is being used for the military purposes specified in Byelaw No 2 during periods in which that part is not being used for firing purposes. Permission can be sought either from the Range Control Office (Telephone No: Bindon Abbey 462 721 extension 819), or from the master of a range safety craft, who will contact the Range Control Office by radio. There is no restriction under the Byelaws on fishing in the Sea Area when the same is not being used for the military purposes specified in Byelaw No 2.

WARNING

7. The public when allowed to use the East Lulworth-West Eolae Road, the East Lulworth-Whiteway Hill-Creech Hill Road and the road running in a south-easterly direction from the East Lulworth-Whiteway Hill-Creech Hill Road to Steeple and any footpath or picnic site within the Land Area are warned to keep strictly to these roads, footpaths or picnic sites because of the possible danger from unexploded projectiles.

PUBLIC ACCESS TO FOOTPATHS

8. Public access will normally be allowed to those footpaths identified on the "Plan of the Lulworth Ranges - Land Area" during the recesses of the Gunnery School and certain weekends throughout the year. Notices will be published in the local press, giving dates and times when the footpaths will be open to the public. The usual recesses of the Gunnery School are as follows:-

- (a) The Christmas Recess at the end of December and the beginning of January;
- (b) The summer Recess;
- (c) Short Recesses at the times of the Easter, Spring and late Summer public holidays.

When public access is not permitted notices to that effect will be displayed at the entrances to each of the footpaths.

DEMARCATON OF RANGE BOUNDARY

9. The Range boundary is marked at intervals by red flags. Most of these are permanently hoisted but flags at the entry to those roads and footpaths to which access is permitted will be lowered when these are open to the public.

PUBLIC NOTIFICATION OF FIRING

10. (1) Public Notification that firing will take place will be given by the publication of a Notice, not later than Thursday of the preceding week, in the Dorset Evening Echo, the Evening Echo, Bournemouth and the Western Gazette, giving particulars of the intended time and duration of the firing.

(2) A similar Notice will also be sent, not less than seven clear days before the day or night of firing to the following persons and authorities:-
