## Environmental Information Regulations A47 verge spraying

Thank you for your email of 9 May requesting information, including background policy documents, relating to our decision to spray areas around signs, posts and lay-bys on the A47 between King's Lynn and the Easton Roundabout in Norfolk.

We spray herbicides to control vegetation to:

- enable us to inspect street furniture such as signs, posts, kerbs and drains more easily.
- improve the safety of our road workers by reducing the number of times they need to go out onto high speed roads to cut the grass. One spray application is the equivalent of up to 6 cuts.
- reduce the potential for flying debris and potential incidents that cutting and strimming may cause.
- reduce noise (from cutting machinery) which may impact those living close to where we are operating.

More information can be found in our Asset Maintenance and Operational Requirements which states that we must 'maintain and preserve road users' visibility of road traffic signs and signals'

We carry out weed control measures twice a year in spring and autumn. We don't spray more frequently as we recognise the critical role of pollinators and support the National Pollinator Strategy through our Biodiversity Action Plan.
