

NOTICE OF ORDER

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

SECTION 53

Suffolk County Council
(Gipping Rural District Definitive Map and Statement) (Parish of Needham Market)
Modification Order 2017

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. Following an earlier inquiry the Inspector appointed to determine the Order issued a letter in which he proposed to make modifications to the Order as drafted. Following advertisement of those proposals objections/representations have been received.

The **start date** for the above Order is 28 June 2019

Consideration of the Order will take the form of exchanges of statements of case and comments on statements of case which contain evidence in respect of the Inspector's proposed modifications only.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by adding the following two public footpaths in Needham Market, as shown on the order map:

- (1) From a footway leading from Hargrave Avenue at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) 60896,25453 in an easterly direction for 49 metres to the footway on the western side of Barking Road (B1078) at OSGR 60901,25453.
- (2) From a footway leading from Hargrove Avenue at (OSGR) 60896,25453, in a north easterly and then a northerly direction for 44 metres, to the footway on the southern side of Chainhouse Road at OSGR 80898,25457.

The effect of the proposed modifications would be:

In the Schedule to the Order, Part I, amend the second paragraph to read:

"A footpath from a point at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) 60896,25453 (Point X) to a point at OSGR 60900,25453 (Point Y) as shown on the attached map, and"

In the Schedule to the Order, Part II, amend the second paragraph to read:

"Needham Market Footpath 20

Commencing at its junction with a footway leading from Hargrave Avenue at OSGR 60896,25453 and progressing in an easterly direction over a metalled surface for a distance of 29 metres to the footway in front of the shops at Nos. 16-30a Barking Road at OSGR 60900,25453"

Amend the Order Map accordingly.

Timetable for sending in statements of case and comments

Within 8 weeks of the start date [by 23 August 2019]

The Order Making Authority, the applicant and everyone who has made an objection or representation following the proposed modifications or any other written representation must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after receiving it the Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation following the proposed modifications, the applicant and any other person who has previously written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 4 October 2019]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation following the proposed modifications, the Authority, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who has written to us in respect of the Order must ensure their comments on any or every other statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the above date, the Secretary of State will send copies of the comments received to everyone else.

Any other person wishing to make representations in writing to the Secretary of State in respect of the above Order must do so in line with the timetable set out above.

In fairness to the other parties everyone should keep to the timetable to ensure that statements of case and comments are received on time.

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.
