Notes to the Accounts Year ended 31 December 2018

1 Accounting Policies

a) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements of the Union have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 Section 1A applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland.

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with applicable accounting standards and on the going concern basis.

b) Income

Subscription income is accounted for when received by the Union or included in a return of income and expenditure from a branch. No allowance is made to reflect subscriptions due but not paid.

c) Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on the accruals basis and includes expenses incurred by branches.

d) Going Concern

These accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis as the officers' have a reasonable expectation that the Union has adequate resources to continue for the foreseeable future

2 General Fund

The General fund has grown due to an increase in the number of members. During the year £2,892 was transferred to the Organisation Department Working Fund from the General Fund.

3 Organising Department Working Group Fund

This fund was established in 2009 to provide training, research and other support to help branches and members organise locally and nationally. During the year funds were transferred from General Fund to Organsing Fund to form the organising department budget for 2018. The Organising fund balance as at the blance sheet date amounted to £3,000.

4 Officers' Responsibilities

The Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992 requires the Union to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view. In preparing these financials statements the Union is required to:

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of the Industrial Workers of the World (IWW) for the year ended 31 December 2018 which comprise the income and expenditure account, the balance sheet and notes to the financial statements, which have been prepared under the accounting policies set out in the Notes to the accounts.
