

Participation in Education, Training and Employment by 16-18 year olds: End 2018

The proportion of 16-18 year olds in education or apprenticeships increased by 0.6ppts to 81.3%, the highest on record

Record proportions of 16/17 year olds in full-time education, most aiming for a qualification at level 3



- Level 3 study (not A levels) increased by 0.6 ppts to 18.9% of 16/17 year olds HIGHEST LEVEL ON RECORD
- Just over a third of these were studying for a tech level or applied general qualification




