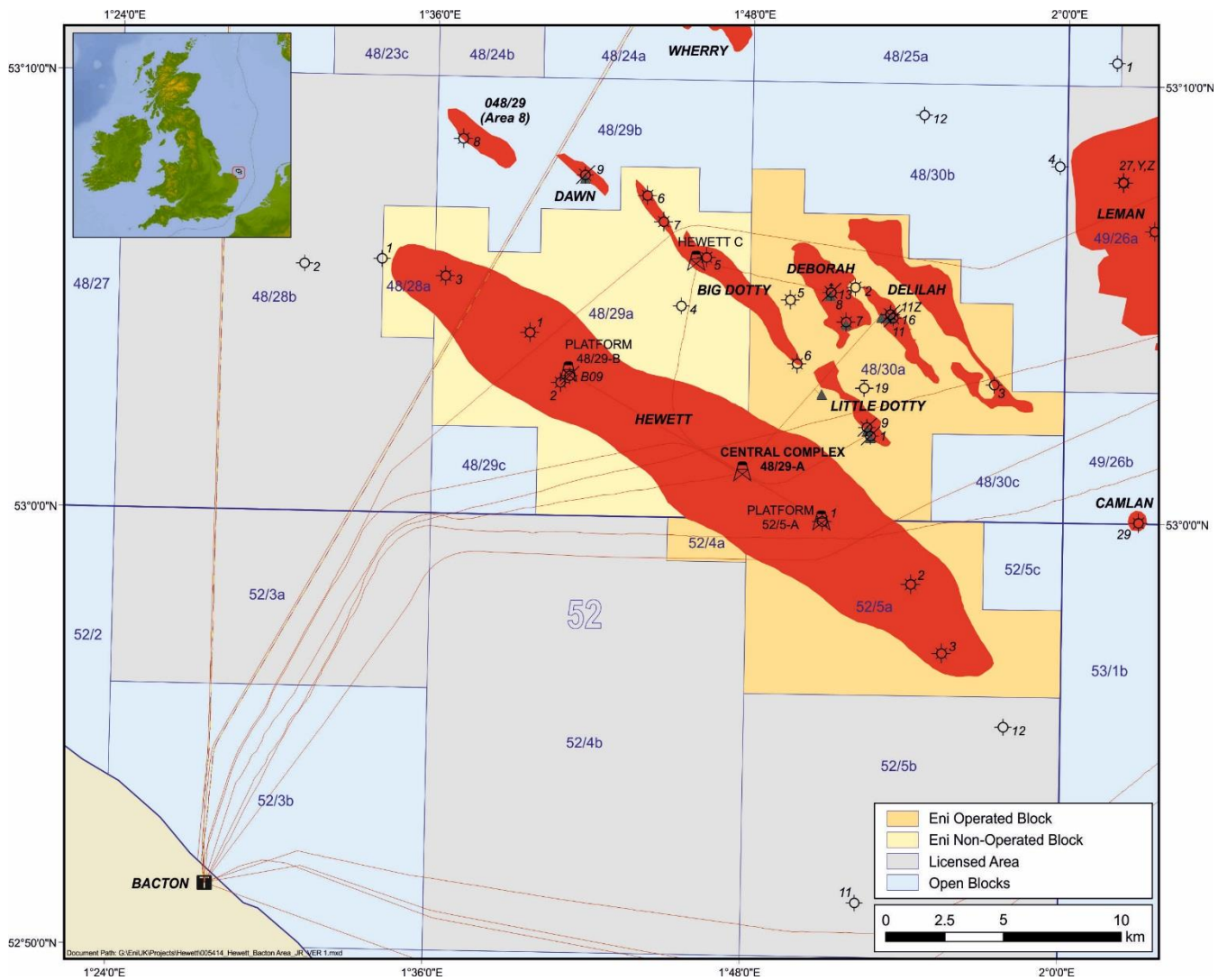

# Eni Hewett Limited OSPAR Annual Public Statement 2018 Environmental Management and Performance Hewett Field Area



## 1. Background and Scope

This is the 2018 OSPAR Public Statement for Eni Hewett Limited, which is a wholly owned subsidiary of Eni UK Limited. The statement reports on the environmental management and performance of relevant operations related to the Eni Hewett Field, in line with the requirements of OSPAR Recommendation 2003/5.

On the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2018, the responsibility for management of the Hewett Field Installations, including related environmental management and respective regulatory requirements, was transferred to Petrofac Facilities Management Ltd (Petrofac) through their appointment as the Hewett Field Installation Operator. Eni Hewett Ltd continued to act as the Hewett Field Well Operator during 2018.

This statement reports on the environmental management and performance in terms of the Hewett Field Wells, the role of the Well Operator and related environmental regulatory processes which apply to Well Operations. Environmental management and performance related to the Hewett Field Installations and associated production operations is reported within the scope of the Petrofac OSPAR Public Statement, as part of their role as Hewett Field Installation Operator.

These assets do not produce through any third party offshore assets or operations.

## 2. Hewett Field Offshore Operations and Activities

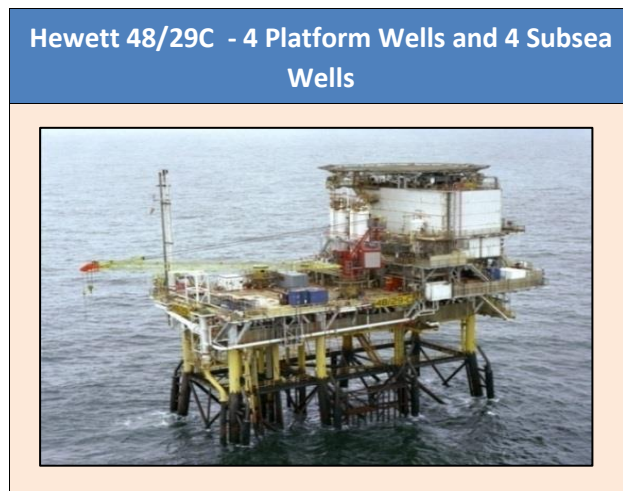
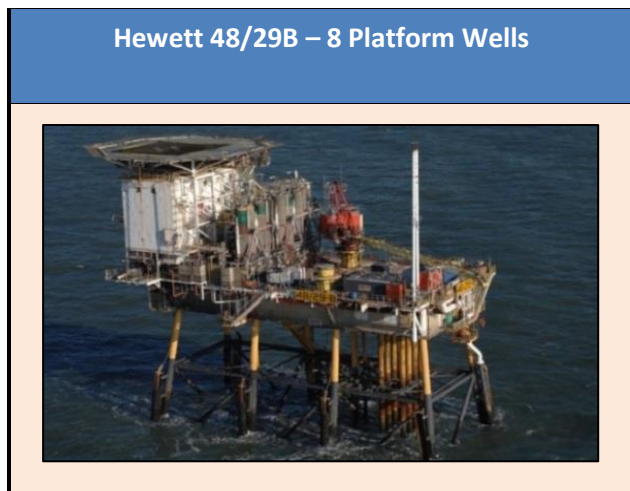
During 2018, production operations continued from the Hewett Field subsea and platform wells via the Hewett Field installations comprised of the Central Complex (49/28A-P, FTP & Q) and the satellite installations (52/5A, 48/29B and 48/29C) and connected pipeline infrastructure.

The Hewett Field Wells are an integral part of the Hewett Field Installations, with production flow from the wells passing through the Hewett Installation processing facilities and connected infrastructure.

**Atmospheric Emissions**

During 2018, direct emissions associated with Hewett Field Well Operations were limited to vented gas volumes. These emissions are included as part of the overall emissions from the Hewett Field as reported into the Environmental Emissions Monitoring System (EEMS) through the Department of Business Energy and Industrial Strategy [BEIS] UK Oil Portal.

Information on atmospheric emissions associated with Hewett Field Installations production and maintenance operations is included within the scope of the Petrofac OSPAR Statement for the Hewett Field Installations.

**Water Discharges**

There were no direct water discharges associated with the Hewett Field Well Operations during 2018.

Management of liquids associated with the Hewett Field Installation production operations (including produced and process water) and any related discharges are reported within the scope of the Petrofac OSPAR Statement for the Hewett Field Installations.

### Chemical Use and Discharge (Production)

Eni Hewett Ltd maintain permits as required under the Offshore Chemical Regulations for the use and discharge of chemicals associated with Hewett Field Well Operations. The tables below summarise the total 2018 chemical use across the Hewett installations in relation to Well Operations, including volumes and Hazard Quotient (HQ) Category.

Chemicals used for the purposes Well Operations are subject to continual review and Eni will continue to seek suitable alternatives, where appropriate.

Chemical use and discharge related to operation of the Hewett Field Installations is reported within the scope of the Petrofac OSPAR Statement for the Hewett Field Installations.

### Waste Management

All wastes generated from the operation and maintenance of Hewett Installations are reported within the scope of the Petrofac Statement for the Hewett Installations, including incidental and general wastes such as general consumables, welfare and accommodation, installation utilities and ancillary equipment. There were no wastes generated directly as a result of Well Operations performed during 2018.

### Non-Compliances

During 2018 there were no regulatory Non Compliances in relation to Hewett Field Well Operations. Regulatory non-compliances reported in relation to the Installations are reported as part of the Petrofac Installation Operator statement.

### 3. Eni Hewett HSE Management

#### HSE Policy

Eni Hewett Ltd adopts the Eni UK Ltd HSE policy (see overleaf), which sets out the principles with which Eni Hewett activities and operations aim to comply. These include:

- Promoting Health, Safety and Environmental Protection;
- Seeking and achieving continual improvement;
- Compliance with all regulatory requirements.

The requirements of the Policy are implemented through management systems, interface arrangements and operational management controls implemented for Hewett Well Operations, in conjunction with Petrofac as the Installation Operator, as part of the overall management of the Hewett Installations and Hewett Field.


#### HSE Management System

Eni Hewett Ltd applies the Eni UK Environmental Management System, which is Certified to ISO 14001:2015 (see copy of certificate overleaf).

Eni Hewett Ltd adopts and applies the Eni UK Health, Safety and Environmental Management System, which sets out guiding principles and mechanisms for managing HSE risks, impacts and compliance in accordance with the Eni UK Health, Safety and Environment Policy.

A formalised HSE Management System Interface is in place between Eni Hewett Ltd and Petrofac to provide the mechanism for implementing Eni requirements through Petrofac's HSE and Operational management systems, to manage and control operational activities. Routine communications between Eni Hewett and Petrofac are planned and maintained to review management arrangements, plans and performance to ensure requirements are being complied with and reported in line with Regulatory and Company requirements.

## Eni UK HSE Policy



The safety and health of Eni's people, of the community and of its partners, and the protection of the environment are top priorities for Eni in all its activities.

Eni UK conducts its activities in accordance with all compliance obligations in the countries where it works and with all other applicable requirements and standards concerning the safeguarding of the health and safety of workers and of the environment.

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### HSE Management Activities during 2018

Eni Hewett Ltd maintain plans and objectives for environmental management which focus on ensuring compliance with relevant environmental permits and regulations, managing risks and supporting continued improvement in performance. During 2018 this included:

- Maintenance of the Well Operator and Installation Operator ISO 14001 EMS certifications;
- Offshore EMS audits and inspections;
- Onshore Emergency Response exercises and Offshore Drills;
- Monitoring of asset performance and Environmental KPIs;
- Maintenance of the asset's Environmental Risk and Aspects Registers
- The formal appointment of Petrofac as the Installation Operator and continued management of the transition of the installations under the SCR15 Regime (EU Offshore Safety Directive) and related management interfaces between Eni Hewett Ltd and Petrofac.
- Planning for the cessation of production and subsequent decommissioning of the Hewett Field.

### HSE Management Activities 2019 Planning

The main aims and objectives for the Hewett Assets during 2018 are:

- ✓ Ongoing maintenance and implementation of the Environmental Management System, including
  - Certification to the 14001:2015 Standard;
  - Environmental data monitoring and reporting schedules;
  - Environmental Key Performance Indicators [KPIs];
  - Environmental Aspects Registers and Controls;
- ✓ Audit and review of Environmental Permit compliance associated Environmental Management Systems;
- ✓ Continued management of asset and well integrity, as well as process safety to minimise the risk of spills;
- ✓ Continued planning and implementation of Hewett Field decommissioning operations, including continued implementation and development of required Environmental Management Systems and Controls.





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
