Thank you for your e-mail of 16 June 2019 requesting the following information:

Please could you let me know why the sale of vehicle spares has been suspended.

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that all the information in scope of your request is held.

The information you have requested can be found below.

We can confirm that there is no suspension on the sale of vehicle spares.

Under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) you may find it helpful to note that the Defence Equipment Sales Authority (DESA) who is the sole authority within the MOD for the sale of surplus military equipment and inventory including vehicle spare parts from the UK armed forces, has the responsibility to ensure that the disposal of vehicle spare parts is managed via the most economical, safe and environmentally efficient means. As part of a recent review on the value for money to the tax payer from the sale of surplus spare parts against environmental, safety and security concerns resulting from the sale of surplus spare parts to the general public, it was noticed that a greater number of spare parts are now being disposed as waste to ensure that the UK MOD is protected against environmental, safety and security risks.
