Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The start date for the above Order is 30 July 2019.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of a public local inquiry.

The Inquiry will be held at **the Belsay Meeting Room, County Hall, Morpeth, Northumberland, NE61 2EF** on **Tuesday 28 January 2020** at 10.00am.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by:-

Former Berwick-upon-Tweed Borough

Byway Open to All Traffic No 20 (Parish of Bamburgh)

Adding thereto a byway open to all traffic, from a point marked R, on the B1340 road, 250 metres north-east of Greenhill, in a general southwesterly, southerly then easterly direction along the U2021 road, then part of the U2018 road for a distance of 1370 metres, to a point marked S, on alleged Byway Open to All Traffic No 17, in the Parish of North Sunderland, 135 metres west of Saddlershall.

Byway Open to All Traffic No 17 (Parish of North Sunderland)

Adding thereto a byway open to all traffic, from a point marked S, on alleged Byway Open to All Traffic No 20, in the Parish of Bamburgh, 135 metres west of Saddlershall, in a general easterly then south-easterly direction along part of the U2018 road, for a distance of 820 metres, to a point marked T, on the Shoreston Hall - Springhill section of the U2018 road, 50 metres south-west of Shoreston Hall.

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to everyone who has made an objection or representation and the applicant and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 5 November 2019]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their statement of case¹ is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send full copies to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

4 weeks before the date of the inquiry [by 31 December 2019]

The Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their proof of evidence (together with any summary) is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of:

This Order is made by Northumberland County Council under Section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the Act") because it appears to that authority that the Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for the County of Northumberland require modification in consequence of the occurrence of events specified in Section 53(3)(c)(i) and (iii), namely, the discovery by the authority of evidence which (when considered with all other relevant evidence available to them) shows that a right of way which is not shown in the map and statement subsists or is reasonably alleged to subsist over land in the area to which the map relates, being a right of way such that the land over which the right subsists is a public path, a restricted byway or, subject to section 54A, a byway open to all traffic; and that there is no public right of way over land shown in the map and statement as a highway of any description, or any other particulars contained in the map and statement require modification.

The authority has consulted every local authority whose area includes the land to which the order relates. The Northumberland County Council hereby order that:

- 1. For the purposes of this Order the relevant date is 1 September 2016.
- 2. The Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for the County of Northumberland shall be modified as described in the Schedule and shown on the map attached to the Order.
- This Order shall take effect on the date it is confirmed and may be cited as The Northumberland County Council Definitive Map Modification Order (No 30) 2016.


