Cornwall Council Public Footpath No. 3 Colan (Trevithick Manor Farm) Public Path Diversion Order 2018

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is **3 July 2019**.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of a public local inquiry.

The Inquiry will be held at **The Atlantic Hotel**, **1 Dane Road**, **Newquay**, **Cornwall**, **TR7 1EN** on **Tuesday 26 November 2019** at 10.00am.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to extinguish the entire length of Public Footpath number 3 in the Parish of Colan commencing from a point where it has a junction with the southern margin of County Road A392 approximately 20 metres west-north-west of the property the "King's Head" at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) SW 8271/6014 shown as point "A" on the attached map and continuing in a generally south-south-easterly then south-easterly direction for approximately 302 metres to a point where it has a junction with the western margin of County Road C0181 approximately 267 metres south-east of the "King's Head" at OSGR SW 8292/5994 shown as point "B" on the attached map and to create a length of Public Footpath in the Parish of Colan commencing from a point whre it has a junction with the southern margin of County Road A392 approximately 20 metres westnorth-west of the property the "King's Head" at OSGR SW 8271/6013 shown as point "C" on the attached map and continuing in a generally southerly then east-north-easterly then south-south-easterly then eastnorth-easterly then south-south-easterly then east-north-easterly direction for approximately 314 metres to a point where it has a junction with the western margin of County Road C0181 approximately 202 metres south-east of the "King's Head" at OSGR SW 8291/6004 shown as point "D" on the attached map.

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. THE CORNWALL COUNCIL PUBLIC FOOTPATH No. 3 COLAN (TREVITHICK MANOR FARM) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2018

This Order is made by Cornwall Council ("the authority") under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the authority that in the interests of the owners of the land crossed by the footpath described in paragraph 1 of this order it is expedien: that the line of the path should be diverted.

The applicant for the Order, Persimmon Homes (Cornwall), has agreed to defray any compensation which becomes payable in consequence of the coming into force of this order and any expenses which are incurred in bringing the new site of the path into a fit condition for use by the public.

BY THIS ORDER:

- 1. The public footpath over the land situated at "Trevithick Manor Farm" in the Parish of Colan shown by a bold black continuous line on the map contained in this order and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this order shall be stopped up on the date on which Cornwall Council certify that work has been carried out to bring the site of the new path mentioned in Part 2 of the Schedule to this order into a fit condition for use by the public.
- Notwithstanding paragraph 1 of this order statutory undertakers shall have the same rights over the land referred to in paragraph 1 above, in respect of their apparatus under, in, upon, over, along, or across the said land as they had immediately before the date of confirmation of this order.
- 3. There shall at the end of 14 days from the date of confirmation of this order be a public footpath over the land situate south of area known as "Trevithick Manor Farm" in the Parish of Colan described in Part 2 of the Schedule to this order and shown by a bold black broken line on the map attached to this order.
- The rights conferred on the public under this order shall be subject to the limitations and conditions set out in Part 3 of the Schedule.
- This order may be cited as "The Cornwall Council Public Footpath No. 3 Colar (Trevithick Manor Farm) Public Path Diversion Order 2018".

DESCRIPTION OF SITE OF EXISTING PATH OR WAY

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The entrie length of Public Fuotpath number 3 in the Parish of Colan commencing from a point where it has a junction with the southern margin of County Road A392 in the Parish of Colan approximately 20 metres west-north-weat of the property the "King's Head" at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) SW 9271/8014 shown as point "A" on the attached map and continuing in a generally south-easterly then south-easterly direction for approximately 302 metres to a point where it has a junction with the western margin of County Road C0181 in the Parish of Colan approximately 267 metres south-east of the "King's Head" at OSGR SW 8292/5/64 shown as point "B" on the attached map

The Definitive Statement does not record any information as to the width of Public Footpath number 3 Colan. For the avoidance of doubt the intention of the order is to stop up the length of highway described above in its entirely.

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A length of Public Footpath in the Parish of Colan commencing from a point where it has a junction with the southern margin of County Road A392 in the Parish of Colan approximately 20 metres west-north-west of the property the "King's Head" at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) SW 8271/6013 shown as point "C" on the attached map thence running in a generally southerly then east-north-easterly then south-south-easterly then east-north-easterly direction for approximately 314 metres to a point where it has a junction with the western margin of County Road C0181 in the Parish of Colan approximately 202 metres south-east of the "King's Head" at OSGR SW 8291/6004 shown as point "D" on the attached map.

The new Publicly Maintained Highway described above will be 1.8 metres wide throughout.


