Freedom of Information Act M11 Accident Data

Thank you for your email of 12 July requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 about the number of fatalities on the M11. We have now completed our search for the information requested.

Information relating to road traffic collisions in Great Britain is collected annually by the Department for Transport. To allow for the information to be properly validated it is typically published during the summer of the year *after* it is collected. Therefore, data for 2018 is not yet available but will be published later this summer. The information we are providing includes up to 2017.

In withholding the information, I am relying upon the exemption under <u>Section 22 (1)</u> information intended for future publication.

In applying this exemption, we have had to balance the public interest in withholding the information against the public interest in disclosure which are set out at the end of this letter.

We have no data available for 2019.

I have extracted the elements of your request and respond as follows:

Request for Accident Data between M11 junctions 6 and 8 since 2010 until present

FOIA Exemption S.22 – Information intended for future publication

Factors supporting disclosure

Disclosure of the information would be consistent with our commitment to proactively publishing data on matters of the wider public interest

 The public has an interest in learning the number and type of incidents that have occurred on any given section of the road network and expects data to be available.

Factors supporting non-disclosure

- Validated 2018 data is intended for publication by the Department for Transport later this year, 2019.
- Unvalidated data is likely to include errors and omissions that will be corrected during the validation process
- Publication on the Gov.uk website will take place once the validation process has been completed
- As the information is of interest to the wider public it is important it can be accessed simultaneously by the public rather than piecemeal by disclosure to a small number of individuals under the FOIA. Therefore, it is in the wider interest that information is accessible to the public adhering to the publication schedule.

Conclusion: There are compelling arguments which support withholding the information which outweigh those supporting release.
