Thank you for your emails of 9 June in which you requested the following information:

Can you please clarify how many staff (FTE) were employed in 2018 to answer public and ministerial correspondence.

Also how many such correspondence was received (i.e. in addition to the FOI request how many parliamentary questions, media questions and public queries were received in 2018?

You then refined the second part of your request to be for:

parliamentary questions, ministerial and treat official correspondence,

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD), and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held and has been provided below.

The table below shows calendar year 2018 Army Command correspondence by type:

Parliamentary Questions (PQ)	284
Ministerial Correspondence (MC)	306
Treat Officials (TO)	377

Please note that these figures are a single service estimate and is not an official statistic produced by Defence Statistics.

'FTE' has been interpreted as 'Full Time Equivalent'. The number of Full Time Equivalent (FTE) staff who were employed to answer PQs, MCs and TOs by the Army Command in 2018 is not held.

Under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) you may find it helpful to note that all Army Command staff who deal with these types of correspondence as part of their role also work on other Parliamentary business. The amount of time taken to deal specifically with these types of correspondence is not held and therefore FTE cannot be calculated.

A single Service estimate of the overall number of PQs, MCs and TOs dealt with by the Ministry of Defence in 2018 has been provided in the table below to provide context:
