Thank you for your emails of 13 May in which you requested the following information:

1 In the past three years, with figures given annually, how many soldiers in the Duke of Lancaster's Regiment have tested positive during compulsory drugs tests?

If possible, please list the class of drug, and state the soldier's rank, where they were based, and whether they were discharged as a result of the positive result.

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. Please accept my apologies for the amount of time it has taken to provide the information requested. A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD), and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held and has been provided below. Some of this information is exempt from release under section 40 (Personal Data) of the FOIA. Section 40(2) has been applied to some of the information to protect personal information as governed by the Data Protection Act 2018. Section 40 is an absolute exemption and there is therefore no requirement to consider the public interest in deciding to withhold the information.

Please note that these figures are single service estimates and are not official statistics produced by Defence Statistics. Figures have been rounded to the nearest five to limit disclosure and ensure confidentiality. '~' denotes fewer than five.
