Dear [REDACTED],

Thank you for your e-mail of 13 June 2019 asking for documentation about the RAF Police (RAFP). Specifically, you requested the following information:

*"How many LTI speed enforcement laser devices are operated by your Royal Air Force Police.*

*What models of LTI speed enforcement laser devices are operated by your Royal Air Force Police ?*

*In respect of the LTI devices used for speed enforcement what servicing and calibration takes place and how often is this checked ? over the last 24 months has RAF Police experienced any faults or other issues operating LTI devices for speed enforcement.*

*Please could you provide a list of RAF Police units and the structure of the Royal Air Force Police where units are located, breakdown of strength on each unit and HQ."*

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

The RAFP have 17 devices including the *UNIPAR SL700, LTI 20:20UltrLyte 100, LTI 2020 UltraLyte.yte, LTI Truspeed dc "Tele Traffic", Urban Speed Ace and Unipar SL700*. These devices are all calibrated and serviced on an annual basis. No significant faults or issues have been recorded with the equipment although on one device an error message appears on the first use but this clears on second use.

The table below provides a breakdown of the RAFP structure including numbers of posts and locations where units are based in the UK. RAFP personnel are also dispersed across the RAF in posts which fall outside the RAFP structure and command. The number of personnel actually in post can fluctuate.


