## Officer Cadet Survey - Cover Note 2018/19

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The statistical release found separately provides results from the Officer Cadet Survey (OCS) 2018/19. The OCS is administered to four of the Armed Services initial officer training colleges to gauge officer cadets' background, perceptions of training, facilities and food, support, fairness of treatment, general perceptions of the course and hopes for the future. The data is used to inform colleges on their performance, and to compare results with required standards set by the MOD.

## Methodology

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All officer cadets who have completed at least two weeks training were invited to participate in the survey. Participants complete an anonymous and confidential online questionnaire.

The survey was carried out over a 12-month survey period (1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019). During this time, there were 1,165 responses to the questionnaire. Overall, 412 RAF officer cadets, 476 Army officer cadets, 249 Navy officer cadets and 28 RM officer cadets completed the survey.

The overall response rate for all four colleges in 2018/19 was 76% compared with 57% in 2017/18.

There have been small changes in the respondent profile in terms of age and gender. The data is not weighted to take account of non-response.

Totals may not add up to 100% due to rounding.

A detailed explanation of the statistical reliability of this survey is found in Annex A of the main report, however it should be noted that due to non-response we cannot be certain that the figures obtained are exactly those we would have found, had everybody been interviewed (the 'true' values).

For any percentage given 'confidence intervals' within which the true values are likely to fall are estimated. For example; if 10% or 90% of our sample of 1,165 officer cadets strongly agreed that the training was what they expected, we can be 99% confident that the 'true' value would be between 10.2% or 9.2% (if 10% strongly agree) and between 90.8% or 89.2% (if 90% strongly agree) i.e. a margin of 0.8% on each side.
