

EXPORT OF HORSES TO VENEZUELA

NOTES FOR THE GUIDANCE OF THE OFFICIAL VETERINARIAN AND EXPORTER

1. Ref paragraph IV(a): the examination should be carried out within 48 hours of export.
2. The Coggins test mentioned at paragraph IV(d) must be carried out within 30 days of export. Five ml of whole unadulterated blood is required. Samples must be sent to the Veterinary Laboratories Agency, Weybridge not less than 9 days before the proposed export.
3. The treatment mentioned at paragraph (e) must be carried out within 15 days of shipment and applies to both internal and external parasites.
4. The certification contained in paragraph IV(b) and (c) may be signed on the behalf of the Department by a Official Veterinarian provided written authority (Form 618 revised 01/11/1990) has been received. The completed form will be sent to the certifying Official Veterinarian by the Divisional Veterinary Manager(DVM) within 10 days of the export.
5. This certificate must be authenticated by the Venezuelan Consulate in London.
6. Exporters should be reminded that they must comply with the British Welfare Laws relating to the export of horses (including ponies). Information about the necessary requirements and application forms may be obtained either from:
