Hello

I would like to speak to you please to discuss the planned closures of the M2. We are fully aware of the impact of last weekend and need to identify agreeable ways forward. I would welcome your insight as to how we may do this in collaboration with KCC, with the aim of delivering a strategic road network that is robust enough to cope with the potential consequences of Brexit around Kent.

I discussed the impact from weekend with A-One and asked them to consider what additional measures could be put into place to reduce the impact on the KCC network if we were to continue as planned. I understand many of the vehicles observed as being caught up in the congestion were foreign registered cars, coaches and HGVs. The following gives an overview of the options we identified:

- Ask utility company to not work the weekends and remove the temporary lights on A2 (may involve temporary back fill).
- Dover Port to close the dedicated link to Jubilee Way, hence encouraging traffic to divert to A2/ M20.
- Switch off the traffic signals at Brenley Corner during the works allowing more free flow movement.
- 4. Use Kent-online media to publish the closures in a positive light.
- Issue leaflets to drivers leaving Port in different languages.

6. Get the ferry operators to make announcements to drivers advising them of the closures and to use A2/M20.

The above would have to be delivered as a whole package to work, but cannot provide full assurance that the impact will be significantly reduced. What are your thoughts on this?

Feedback I had was that the impact was greatly reduced on Sunday. I don't know if this was as a result of knowledge of the Saturday, or if Sunday traffic is generally less busy. Do you have a view on whether we could close from Saturday evening to Monday morning (similar to how we delivered Northfleet Green at Easter), if not the full weekend?

As you know, road space on the whole Kent corridor is at a premium. I have asked A-One to advise me what the impact will be on cancelling the weekend closures (approx. an additional 4 weeks of night time only). I am advised a full weekend closure will generate 3800 tonnes of material laid, Saturday evening to Monday approx. 1800t and a typical night shift 300t. Looking at the current KCCG bi-weekly road space plan we would have endless clashes if we revert to night time only. Thus I welcome your support in trying to find a way to help deliver this work, whilst trying to minimise the impact on the customers of HE, KCC and Medway networks.

Please give me a call back when you are able to.
