

STATISTICS ON GROSS PUBLIC EXPENDITURE (GPEX) ON INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Overview

This release provides statistics on Gross Public Expenditure (GPEX) on International Development from 2011/12 to 2017/18. The data covers expenditure by the Department for International Development, known as the DFID programme.

Box 1: Gross Public Expenditure (GPEX) on International Development

GPEX covers expenditure by official sources on aid to developing countries on the OECD Development Assistance Committee (DAC) list of ODA eligible countries and multilateral organisations, and some other countries which meet the criteria for developmental Official Flows agreed by the DAC. GPEX is reported on a financial year basis and covers gross flows.

GPEX statistics are published in tandem with [Statistics on International Development \(SID\)](#), a National Statistical report that focuses on UK Official Development Assistance (ODA), the key international measure of aid spend.

Generally speaking, users should refer to UK ODA figures as published in *SID* as these follow international reporting practices. Users interested in the full spend of DFID specifically (not just ODA) should use the data published in this release covering GPEX.

Background Notes

1. The GPEX data for the DFID programme is sourced from DFID's internal accounting and management information system (ARIES) and the UK attributions of EC budgetary spending.
2. The GPEX statistics presented in this release are produced on a mainly cash basis and are broadly consistent with the standards followed in the reporting of ODA in *SID*. The statistics are therefore not directly comparable with the financial information reported in DFID's Annual Report and Accounts, which is shown on a resource basis. DFID spend through cross-government funds (Conflict, Stability and Security Fund and the Prosperity Fund) is also included.

Minor revisions and changes

We constantly seek to improve the quality of our statistics. Through our routine checks of historical GPEX data we may discover errors or make corrections, due to later data becoming available, and make minor revisions to previous years' data. Where we do so, the revised data will be clearly marked in the published tables by the symbol ^R.

We are continually assessing the added value our publications provide to users in terms of content and transparency. We are considering future changes to the GPEX report that could lead to streamlining this publication.
