Norfolk County Council (Thompson, Pockthorpe Lane) Modification Order
2018

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is 22 October 2019

Consideration of the Order will take the form of a public local inquiry.

The Inquiry will be held at **Thompson Community Hall, School Road, Thompson, Norfolk IP24 1PY** on **Tuesday 7 April 2020** at 10.00am.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to modify the Definitive Map and Statement by adding:

In the Parish of Thompson

Byway Open to All Traffic (Pockthorpe Lane to Sparrow Hill) Starts from the western end of the U33191 Pockthorpe Lane, Thompson at grid reference TL 9147 9669 and runs in a generally westerly direction for approximately 43 metres to a field gate at grid reference TL 9143 9670. The route then continues in a generally westerly direction for approximately 240 metres to grid reference TL 9120 9674 where it turns to run in a north-north westerly direction for approximately 8 metres to a field gate at grid reference TL 9119 9675. The route then continues in a generally north north-westerly direction for approximately 455 metres where it passes through another field gate at grid reference TL9107 9719 and joins the U33437 Sparrow Hill. The overall length of the way is approximately 746 metres.

The width of the way in sections as shown by the pecked and solid lines on the Ordnance Survey Map of 1905 Scale 1:2,500 as follows and as indicated on the map attached to the Norfolk County Council (Thompson, Pockthorpe Lane) Modification Order 2018.

Timetable for sending in statements of case and proofs of evidence

Within 8 weeks of the start date by [by 17 December 2019]

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to everyone who has made an objection or representation and the applicant and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 28 January 2020]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their statement of case¹ is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send full copies to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

4 weeks before the date of the inquiry [by 10 March 2020]

The Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their proof of evidence (together with any summary) is

received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of:

- i) the Authority's proof of evidence to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and anyone who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence);
- ii) the applicant's proof of evidence to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence); and
- iii) all other proofs of evidence to the Authority, the applicant, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence).

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case and proofs of evidence are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.

This Order is made by Norfolk County Council ("the Authority") under Section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the Act") because it appears to the Authority that the Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for the County of Norfolk ("the Definitive Map and Statement") require modification in consequence of events specified in Section 53(3)(c)(i) namely:-

- (a) Section 53(3)(c)(i) – the discovery by the Authority of evidence which (when considered with all other relevant evidence available to them) shows that a right of way which is not shown in the map and statement subsists or is reasonably alleged to subsist over land in the area to which the map relates.

The Authority has consulted with every local authority whose area includes the land to which the Order relates.

The Norfolk County Council hereby orders that:-

1. For the purposes of this Order the relevant date is 1 January 2018
2. The Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for the County of Norfolk shall be modified as described in Part I and Part II of the Schedule and shown on the map attached to this Order.
3. This Order shall take effect on the date it is confirmed and may be cited as the Norfolk County Council (Thompson, Pockthorpe Lane) Modification Order 2018

In the Parish of Thompson

Byway Open to All Traffic (Pockthorpe Lane to Sparrow Hill) Starts from the western end of the U33191 Pockthorpe Lane, Thompson at grid reference TL 9147 9669 (point A on the map attached to this Order) and runs in a generally westerly direction for approximately 43 metres to a field gate at grid reference TL 9143 9670 (point B on the map attached to this Order) the route then continues in a generally westerly direction for approximately 240 metres to grid reference TL 9120 9674 (point E on the map attached to this Order) where it then turns to run in a north-north westerly direction for approximately 8 metres to a field gate at grid reference TL 9119 9675 (point F on the map attached to this Order). The route then continues in a generally north north-westerly direction for approximately 455 metres where it passes through another field gate at grid reference TL 9107 9719 (point G on the map attached to this Order) and joins the U33437 Sparrow Hill.

The overall length of the way is approximately 746 metres.

The width of this way is as follows and as indicated on the map attached to this Order

Section A to B – 5.5 metres

Section B to C – 4.0 metres

Section C to D – 5.5 metres narrowing to 2.6 metres

Section D to F – 2.6 metres

Section F to G – 3.0 metres

Limitations and conditions – Field Gates at grid references TL 9143 9670, TL 9119 9675 and TL 9107 9719.


