Thank you for your email of 18 June 2019 requesting the following information:

"Under the FOI Act could you please provide details of the number and location of all MoD/Armed forces golf courses and the annual cost of maintaining the golf courses."

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD) and I can confirm that some of the information in scope of your request is held.

The information you have requested concerning the number and location of all MOD/Armed Forces golf courses can be found enclosed in the table below:

The Ministry of Defence has 19 Golf Courses on its land, these are shown below:

The information you have requested concerning the annual cost of maintaining the golf courses is not held.

Under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) you may find it helpful to know that in regard to the part of your request concerning the annual cost of maintaining the golf courses, I can advise the money spent on running golf courses is not separately identifiable from the operating costs of the site as a whole.

The golf courses on the MOD estate are used by defence personnel and their families, They are generally self-financed or leased to external parties. Golf courses are usually present under what is called a "Service Encroachment" which describes the authorised use of irreducible spare capacity in public-funded MOD property (i.e. land or buildings which cannot be physically separated from the site) by serving Armed Forces personnel, civilians employed by the MOD (including, where practicable, long-term contractors' staff) and their direct dependents for "off-duty" sporting, recreational or welfare activities which cannot otherwise be met by locally provided public facilities.

You may also wish to note that the MOD have announced the plans to close the following sites containing Golf Courses under it's Defence Estate Optimisation Programme; Abercom Barracks,

Ballykinler, County Down; RAF Henlow, Bedford; North Luffenham and Defence School of Policing and Guarding, Southwick, Fareham.
