

Release of Information

Thank you for your correspondence of 12 July 2019 in which you requested the following information:

Your website and career advisors suggest that UCAS points are the only prerequisite qualification accepted for entry as an officer. It is possible for an individual to have a good university degree and have insufficient UCAS points. Is such an individual eligible to enter the Royal Navy as an officer? If yes, how do they get past the careers office that says no? Are there any other equivalent qualifications (ie not UCAS points) that are accepted for officer entry to the Royal Navy?

How many people have been accepted onto Royal Navy officer training with equivalent qualifications (ie not UCAS points) between 2010-2019?'

Your enquiry is being treated as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

A search has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD) and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held.

In response to the first part of your request, I am able to tell you that it is possible for a candidate to be considered for entry to the Royal Navy as an officer without sufficient Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS) points under exceptional circumstances, and to meet the needs of the Service. It may be helpful if I explain that the careers offices are aware of this and each case is looked at by the Admiralty Interview Board on an individual basis. Achievement of a good degree is taken into account and, although there are not many UK qualifications that have not been assessed by UCAS.

qualifications that are recognised by the Government's Register of Regulated Qualifications may also be considered.

With regard to the second part of your request, the MOD does not hold this information as we do not retain records of waivers granted for UCAS points.
