- where certificates for OV signature are sent to the premises of despatch or collected from Department Offices by any person other than the certifying Official Veterinarian, I undertake to ensure that the certificate will be held securely and delivered unopened to that OV;
- the information contained within this application may be disclosed to other competent veterinary authorities or used in the compilation of statistics.
