The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the following public footpaths:-

- A footpath being approximately one hundred and forty (140) metres in length and approximately one point four (1.4) metres width running from Dunsbury Way, Havant in Hampshire to an access road leading to Kingsclere Avenue, Havant aforesaid, as indicated by the bold continuous line between the points marked "B" and "A" on the plan.
- A footpath being approximately one hundred and twenty (120) metres in length and approximately one point four (1.4) metres width running from Dunsbury Way, Havant in Hampshire to an access road leading to Kingsclere Avenue, Havant aforesaid, as indicated by the bold continuous line between the points marked "B" and "C" on the plan.

Copies (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) will also be sent to the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 3 March 2020]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation, the Authority, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who has written to us in respect of the Order must ensure that their comments on any or every other statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of these comments to everyone else.

Any other person wishing to make representations in writing to the Secretary of State in respect of the above Order must do so in line with the timetable set out above.

FOOTPATHS BETWEEN KINGSCLERE AVENUE & DUNSBURY WAY HAVANT HAMPSHIRE 2018

This Order is made by Havant Borough Council ("the authority") under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the authority that in the interests of the owner of the land crossed by the footpaths described in paragraph 1 of this order it is expedient that the line of the paths should be diverted.

Hampshire County Council has been consulted and Hampshire County Council has consented to the making of the order as required by section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

BY THIS ORDER

1. The public rights of way over the land between Kingsclere Avenue and Dunsbury Way, Havant in Hampshire shown by a continuous bold line on the plan contained in this order and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this order shall be stopped up after 110 days from the date of confirmation of this order.

2. There shall be at the end of 110 days from the confirmation of this order be a public footpath over the land situate between Kingsclere Avenue and Dunsbury Way. Havant in Hampshire described in Part 2 of the Schedule and shown by a bold broken line on the plan.

SCHEDULE

PART 1

DESCRIPTION OF THE SITE OF THE EXISTING PATH OR WAY

- 1. A footpath being approximately one hundred and forty (140) metres in length and approximately one point four metres (1.4m) width at its widest point running from Dunsbury Way, Havant in Hampshire to an access road leading to Kingsclere Avenue, Havant aforesaid, as indicated by the bold continuous line between the points marked "A" and "B" on the plan.
- 2. A footpath being approximately one hundred and twenty (120) metres in length and approximately one point four (1.4) metres width running

from Dunsbury Way, Havant in Hampshire to an access road leading to Kingsclere Avenue, Havant aforesaid, as indicated by the bold continuous line between the points marked "C" and "B" on the plan.

PART 2

DESCRIPTION OF SITE OF NEW PATH OR WAY

A public footpath 3 metres wide at its narrowest point commencing at the junction with Dunsbury Way, Havant (Point B on the plan) running in a westerly direction for approximately 96 metres then turning in a northerly direction for 35 metres and then turning back to a westerly direction for 74 metres before diverging into two separate footpaths one leading a short distance to Point C on the plan which adjoins an accessway to Kingsclere Avenue the other continuing in a northerly direction of 55 metres to Point A on the plan which adjoins an additional accessway to Kingsclere Avenue as indicated by a broken black line.
