

NOTICE OF PROPOSAL TO MODIFY DEFINITIVE MAP ORDER

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

Notice is hereby given pursuant to paragraph 8(2) of Schedule 15 to the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 that the Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs to determine the Lancashire County Council Cutler Lane, Height Barn Lane and Stubblelee Lane, Bacup, Rossendale Borough Definitive Map Modification Order 2015 proposes to modify the Order by providing for the following modifications:

“In the Schedule to the Order, Part I, substitute ‘bridleway’ for ‘restricted byway’ or ‘byway open to all traffic’ wherever these terms occur;

In the Schedule to the Order, Part II, substitute ‘bridleway’ for ‘restricted byway’ or ‘byway open to all traffic’ wherever these terms occur;

In the Schedule to the Order, Part II, delete the words ‘Limitations: None’ from the description of Bacup 679 and add ‘Limitations: Field gate at SD 8699 2164’;

In the Schedule to the Order, Part II, delete the words ‘Limitations: None’ from the description of Bacup 680 and add ‘Limitations: Field gate at SD 8728 2173’;

Amend the Order Maps accordingly.”

A copy of the Order as submitted and a copy of the Order showing the proposed modification together with the Inspector's Order decision dated 12 December 2019 have been deposited at Rossendale Borough Council, The Business Centre, Futures Park, Bacup, Lancashire OL13 0BB and may be inspected free of charge during normal working hours.
