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The bid form explained

This free school bid form is for local authorities seeking to establish new special or alternative provision (AP) free schools.

Local authorities (either as a lead or sole bidder) can submit a bid for one special and one AP school in total in their area. Given the limited number of new schools we will create in this wave, it is highly unlikely that we will approve more than one school in any one local authority area. In the most exceptional of circumstances where you plan to make the case for two new schools in your area, you will need to complete a separate bid form for each school, although you should cross-reference where appropriate.

The overview section on the second tab asks for information about the number of bids you are submitting (i.e. one or two), the priority of each bid (if you are submitting two), what (if any) other bids you are supporting, and your expected future need for new special and AP schools (and when they are needed). If you are submitting two bids, you only need to complete the overview page on one form.

If your bid is successful, the opportunity will be advertised nationally, and if a strong proposal comes forward, the new school will be delivered and funded as part of the department's central free schools programme.

Before completing your bid, please ensure that you have read the 'guidance and criteria for local authorities seeking to establish new special or alternative provision free schools' carefully, as this sets out the criteria by which your bid will be judged. Please provide all the information required.

The form should be completed by a local authority representative (or representatives, if it is a joint bid) with the approval of the Director(s) of Children's Services (DCS).

Although there is an existing demand within the system that is currently being met by alternative providers, we would expect this situation to remain in place until a new free school could be constructed. We realise that the building solution in this bid is likely to take up to three years, so we are fully aware that the current arrangements will need to continue until the additional capacity is available.

We are looking for bids in areas where a new school will most support local authorities to manage current and/or anticipated pressures on special school places or on the overall high needs budget, so that the needs of children can be better met. We will not be inclined to approve bids that have the side effect of decreasing the inclusion in mainstream schools of children with SEN, or who are at risk of permanent of fixed term exclusions, or of creating excess spare capacity in existing special or AP school. Bids will score more highly if they can demonstrate that a new school will be filled by students who would otherwise be going to more expensive or poor performing provision.

Box C1 - the current context in your area

Since the introduction of SEND reforms in 2014, Northumberland County Council has seen both a rise in the number of children with statutory EHCP plans and an increase in demand for specialist provision in order to meet the needs of these children and young people. The LA has increased capacity in current special schools by increasing class sizes and with some small scale school adaptations. However, it has been acknowledged that this action alone will not address the current position. The LA is aware that there is a greater demand and agreed need for places than can be accommodated from the current school provision. Special school numbers have risen year on year over the past 5 years, an overall increase of 57%. At the same time as an increasing demand for places, the DfE 2019/20 High Needs Block Allocations published in July 2017 show only an or provision in the High Needs Block allocation between 2017/18.

To cope with this sharp rise in demand, the LA has become increasingly reliant on out-of-county provision. With current charges ranging from per pupil, this is an unsustainable solution to the lack of appropriate places available within Northumberland. As an authority, we spent on out-of-county provision in 2017 and this figure does not include the increasing cost of transport for these young people. Two of the out-of-county SEMH providers used by Northumberland have been rated as Requires Improvement by Ofsted; we are therefore in the unacceptable position of sending our vulnerable young residents out of the area to a poorer standard of education than they would receive within our own schools. The Northumberland schools that would currently meet the needs of these pupils are Cramlington Hillcrest and Atkinson House and they both have been rated Good by Ofsted.

The focus of the new school would be to address the growth in the number of young people in Northumberland being diagnosed with ASD and SEMH through the creation of an 80 place special school in the South East of the county, where the increase in growth in these diagnoses has been most prevalent. Given the proximity of South East Northumberland to the Tyneside conurbation, Newcastle, North Tyneside and Gateshead local authorities have indicated that they would consider placements, with further discussions due to take place around specific numbers. Should Northumberland's bid be unsuccessful, the Council would need to continue to use out of county provision to meet demand in the short term with a view to sourcing alternative funding streams.

The main objective of establishing the proposed provision for 80 young people is for them to achieve better outcomes and improve their life chances. Furthermore, the Table in Section C1i also demonstrates that there are potential annual savings of arising through reductions in the use of independent and non-maintained school fees and associated travel costs by educating these young people within Northumberland close to their home communities.

Northumberland's Vision for SEND

Northumberland is committed to giving all children the best start in life and to support them to reach their full potential.

We want vulnerable children and young people to develop their independence and resilience and to become confident adults who live fulfilled and productive lives.

To this end, we undertake to work in partnership with professionals from a variety of organisations and with children, young people and their families, to ensure that services for children and young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities are of a high quality, accessible, efficient and have the maximum positive impact.

Strategy for high needs provision

The strategy consists of the following six strands:

- 1. Reduce Independent and out-of-county placements and costs through decreasing the number of children and young people being placed in and attending out of county placements. This will be achieved through
- Strengthening the graduated approach in mainstream schools to ensure the notional SEN funding is being maximised;
- Increasing specialist provision within Northumberland for children and young people, particularly for those with social, emotional and health needs.

2. Review funding bands

- Carry out a review of funding bands and definitions with schools to ensure there is standardisation and benchmarking across the system;

- Review 'Top Up' funding system, strengthen monitoring and replace over time with STAR (Short Term Additional Resource).

3. Review the role and funding arrangements of SEND Support Services

- Identify and deliver efficiency savings on SEND Support Services;
- Review the effectiveness of the current SLA arrangements;
- Implement an outcomes framework to monitor the value added by SEND Support Services.

We want to open new schools where they are the right solution for the area. We are looking for bids where a new school will help local authorities meet children's needs, fit into the local authority's strategic plan for high needs provision and complement the local education offer.

Box C3 - why you want a new school and how it fits with your overall strategy

We have an increasing number of pupils with SEMH for whom it has been necessary to make out-of-county provision. Two of these out of area schools have been graded Requires Improvement by Ofsted. As a consequence, the Council places more young people with a particular independent school, resulting in over-reliance on this provider to meet the needs of a broader range of pupils. In addition, we are reviewing the placement of a small number of Northumberland pupils with SEMH with a further NMSS special school that has been rated Requires Improvement. The cost of the out-of-county placements is an inefficient use of of the Council's resources and many of these placements are being made due to capacity issues rather than based on the specific needs of the pupils. All our LA special schools are good or outstanding.

The Local Authority was part of the NE12 Commissioning Framework, with one of the aims of NE12 being to develop the SEND specialist provision in the local area. There has been limited development in this area. One school opened up in South Tyneside, but closed within a term due to safeguarding issues. The one new provider to the area is based in Sunderland and as such is only available for a small proportion of Northumberland students due to distance. Furthermore, the fees for this school are excessive in comparison to other providers. The demand for SEMH places in other authorities as well as Northumberland is increasing and we have had requests for places in the Council's own over-subscribed SEMH school from other local authorities. Three of the LAs that border Northumberland have indicated that they would consider placements with us if the school was established, although as yet there has been no specific agreement in relation to commissioned numbers.

If successful in our application, the Council would expect the need to make out-of-county placements to decrease, although there may continue to be the need to make such placements where it was in the best interests of the relevant young person. By increasing the KS3 and KS4 provision for pupils with SEMH, we would be able to review the designation of our current special schools to ensure that they are appropriate for meeting the needs of the young people in that area. We would also look at creating capacity within our current SEMH secondary school to admit a cohort of pupils in Y5 and Y6 in order to enhance the LA offer. We currently do not have appropriate provision to meet the needs of girls with SEMH and therefore it is proposed that the new provision would be coeducational.

The new school would support pupils to be better prepared for adulthood by planning for this as soon as possible, although no later than by Year 9. Northumberland has an extensive network of alternative providers who have been accepted on to an approved framework, having met a set of required educational standards and having agreed to on-going quality assurance by the Council. We would expect that this school would be included within this network to offer vocational provision and employment tasters to support clearer pathways to employment and further education.

It is the council's stated intention that every child must be in a service that best meets their individual needs. As a result of more local provision in the South East of the county, parental choice will be increased, young people will be able to attend a setting within their home communities and they will spend less time travelling to and from their specialist provision. While this is beneficial to the wellbeing of families and to the young people attending the school, a special school in the preferred location will also lead to significant savings to the Council's high needs budget and SEND transport costs.

We do not envisage the establishment of this school increasing the risk of exclusions from mainstream schools and reducing inclusion. With support from headteachers, we are currently reviewing the process for identifying pupils requiring special school provision to ensure that we have a high degree of rigour when agreeing placements. In addition, we are also in the process of recruiting Inclusion Support Workers into the School Admissions and Inclusion Team. If this bid is successful, the new officers will use the school as their contractual work base. The primary focus of these officers will be to ensure that the educational, social, emotional and health development of children and young people is fully supported by coordinating, appropriate and effective interventions plans. They will also have a key outreach role through the promotion of inclusive practice within mainstream environments to ensure that exclusions are kept to a minimum. In asddition, they will also be supporting the reintegration of permanently excluded learners from alternative provision back into mainstream school. The school will have a strong focus on preparing for young people for adulthood and will establish strong links with Alternative Providers to ensure that students make successful transitions to Post-16 provision either in mainstream colleges or with training providers, with a consequent reduction in the number of young people recorded as NEET.

We expect the school to promote strong educational progress and provide good educational outcomes. Through partnership working and challenge and scrutiny of pupil progress against the agreed outcomes in pupils EHCPs, we believe that the outcomes for students in a more local provision will be significantly better than the current out-of-county arrangements. Northumberland has a history of supporting local special schools to deliver improved outcomes and all the LA special schools are good or outstanding. Although this school will not be maintained by the LA, we will offer the same support and challenge as we do to the other LA special schools.
