### 1. Skills Funding Service: 2016 to 2017 Contracts

#### Information

Last week, we issued the contracts for the 2016 to 2017 funding year for the following programmes using the Skills Funding Service (SFS):

- 19+ apprenticeships

# 4. Report of the Independent Panel on Technical Education and Post-16 Skills Plan Published

#### Information

The government has published a <u>Report of the Independent Panel on Technical</u>

<u>Education</u>. It has also published its <u>Post-16 Skills Plan</u>, which responds to the panel's recommendations and sets out the overarching framework for the skills system.

These documents signal the most radical reforms to post-16 education since the introduction of A-levels. The Post-16 Skills Plan is a fundamentally simplified system, presenting learners with the clear choice of a high quality technical option at 16, alongside the academic option.

Building on the apprenticeships reform, the technical option will give learners a clear line of sight from education into skilled employment.

Further details on how the government will implement the reforms will be provided in the autumn.

### 5. Finance Record Template 2015 to 2016

#### Information

Together with the Education Funding Agency, we have published an updated version of the <u>finance record template</u> for the academic year 2015 to 2016.

Colleges must submit their completed finance record to the SFA by 31 December 2016, using the **EFA information exchange**.

You must submit the finance record template to the respective funding body (SFA or EFA), as part of your annual reports and financial statements. The <u>Accounts Direction</u> <u>for 2015 to 2016 Financial Statements</u> document details this.

We will issue further guidance on how to submit college accounts closer to the deadline.
