1. Funding Statements 2016 to 2017

Information

This week, we will make 2016 to 2017 funding statements available on **the Hub**. The funding statements set out your allocations for:

- Adult Education Budget (including Community Learning and Discretionary Learner Support)
- Adult apprenticeships
- 16 to 18 apprenticeships and SFA-funded traineeships
- Loans facility
- Loans bursary
- Apprenticeship Grant for Employers

2. Apprenticeship Levy: How It Will Work

Information

Last week, the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS) published **guidance** about how the apprenticeship levy will work.

The apprenticeship levy will apply to all UK employers in both the private and public sectors that pay annual bills of more than £3 million.

BIS will publish more detail on the recent Budget announcement that employers will receive a 10% top-up to their monthly levy contributions in April 2016.

3. Funding Rules 2016 to 2017 Version 2

Information

We have published <u>Version 2 of the Funding Rules 2016 to 2017</u>. We have updated these based on your feedback, which we have used to clarify content.

The documents set out the rules for funding, including the evidence required to support funding for 2016 to 2017. These rules will apply from 1 August 2016.

We will also publish the rules for the Apprenticeship Grant for Employers for 16- to 24-year-olds (AGE) in Addendum 4 of the Funding Rules for 2015 to 2016 Version 2. These rules will apply from 1 April 2016.

4. Provider Gateway: Quality Improvement Activity Documents Information

Please do not upload quality improvement activity documents to the self-assessment report (SAR) section of the **Provider Gateway** after **31 March**.

Where supplied, we will collate all quality improvement activity documents uploaded from 1 April 2014 to 31 March 2016 and transfer the information to Ofsted.

In future, Ofsted intends to request this information directly from you each year. Ofsted or the SFA may request this information at the point of inspection notification.

Ofsted will contact all colleges and other training organisations later this year to request updated information. This will set out guidance and timelines of how and when to submit information.

5. Publicly-funded Qualifications Guidance

Information

We have published updated publicly-funded qualifications guidance for awarding organisations. These documents describe how we identify qualifications that are eligible for funding as part of:

- a. 19- to 23-year-old learners' <u>legal entitlement</u> to a first full Level 2, first full Level 3 and English and maths qualifications.
- b. <u>Qualification Eligibility Principles</u> for local flexibilities within the Adult Education Budget.
- c. Advanced Learner Loans.

The updates reflect feedback we have received and align with Version 2 of the Funding Rules 2016 to 2017.

We have published updated guidance on how we identify qualifications that are eligible for funding as part of **Legal Entitlements for 2016 to 2017**. We have also published:

7. Advanced Learner Loans 2016 to 2017

Information

The Advanced Learner Loans 2016 to 2017 application service will be available from 16 May. This is for learners who wish to start eligible qualifications from 1 August 2016 funded with a loan.

To support this, we have updated the <u>Learning and Funding Information</u> letters. You must issue these to learners, including <u>offenders in custody</u>, who are considering funding their qualification with a loan. We have also published <u>guidance</u> on how to complete the letter.
