### 1. IT Apprenticeship Framework Rates Review

#### Information

We are changing the funding rate of the advanced apprenticeship framework in IT, Software, Web & Telecoms Professionals. This is part of our regular review of apprenticeship framework costs to ensure value for public funds.

From 1 April 2016, we will reduce the funding values for new apprenticeship starts only; those already on programme will remain on their existing rates. We will change the competency aims (not knowledge, English or maths aims) for the published rate from £8,673 to £6,650, a 23% reduction.

We will make the new funding rates available on the learning aims search on **the Hub** before the individualised learner record R07 opens on **Monday**, **22 February**.

# 2. FE Choices: Learner Satisfaction and Community Learning Surveys

#### Information

The Learner Satisfaction and Community Learning surveys will close on 1 April. To achieve a representative sample and gain a valid score, please encourage your learners complete the relevant survey:

- a) Learners funded under the Adult Skills Budget, Advanced Learner Loans, and those aged 16 to 18 funded by the Education Funding Agency, must complete the Learner Satisfaction survey.
- b) Learners funded under the Community Learning budget must complete the **Community Learning survey**.

### 3. Qualification Eligibility Principles 2016 to 2017

#### Information

We have published the **Qualification Eligibility Principles** document for the 2016 to 2017 funding year.

This identifies which qualifications and their components, will be eligible for funding as part of local flexibilities through the Adult Education Budget.

To support local area needs and delivery of agreed local outcomes, colleges and other training organisations will decide on the most appropriate form of training provision. This may or may not include qualifications. To support this, we have removed the requirement for all delivery we fund to be in the form of a qualification.

# 5. Advanced Learner Loans: Maximum Amounts for Designated Qualifications

#### Information

We have published the Maximum Loan Amounts for Advanced Learner Loans Designated Qualifications 2016 to 2017 **document**.

This confirms the methodology we will use to calculate maximum Loan amounts. It also confirms what the maximum Loan amounts are for designated qualifications, where learners start these qualifications from 1 August 2016 to 31 July 2017 (inclusive).

We will begin to add qualifications designated for 2016 to 2017 to the learning aims section of **the Hub** and the **Advanced Learner Loans Qualifications Catalogue**. We will do this by the end of February.

We will update the information regularly as we add new designated qualifications to the Loans offer.
