Mid-year Funding Claims 2015 to 2016: Deadline Monday, 8 February

Action

You must make your mid-year funding claims by **Monday**, **8 February** using the digital claim form on **the Hub** if you receive funds through:

- a grant for your Adult Skills Budget
- a grant with an Advanced Learner Loans Bursary contract
- a Discretionary Learner Support contract

The form will include your individualised learner record R06 information and will be available on **Friday**, **5 February**. You must add your forecasts for the remainder of the 2015 to 2016 funding year.

You will not be able to complete the form after the deadline on Monday, 8 February.

2. Funding Rules, Funding Rates and Formula: Online Forum Information

This week, we will publish the first version of the funding rules that we hope will further simplify the adult funding system in 2016 to 2017. To support these, we will also publish a policy briefing on the Adult Education Budget (AEB).

We are making a number of important changes to enable funding decisions to be more accountable to the needs of local areas. 3. 'Recruit an apprentice': March Launch

Information

In March, we will replace <u>Apprenticeship vacancies (Av)</u> with the new, faster and more usable 'Recruit an apprentice' and 'Recruit a trainee' services. We will host the new services on <u>GOV.UK</u>, where they will offer the following benefits:

- 1) Linking users to employers within the site.
- 2) Built-in validations for wages/working hours on the vacancy posting form.
- 3) Simpler vacancy management tools.
- 4) Clearer feedback from our advisers.

They will complement the 'Find an apprenticeship' and 'Find a traineeship' search and application tools we launched for candidates last year.

Transferring these services to **GOV.UK** forms part of the government's wider aim of combining its services onto one platform.
