Legislation dictates that War Pensions Benefits and Allowances are uplifted annually using the Consumer Price Index (CPI) from the previous September. The September 2019 CPI was 1.7%, and this is the amount by which relevant War Pensions Benefits and Allowances have been increased for the 2020/2021 fiscal year, impacted by the various component-level rounding rules.
