Thank you for your recent email, which was processed under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). For clarification, you requested the following information:

Please provide all submitted tender documentation for the winning contractor (AW Demolition Ltd.)

This should include as a minimum:

- Part C Docs to Return
- Any relevant enclosures for 'Part C Docs to Return' such as 'Method of Works', 'How risks are considered' and 'Programme'.

Please also provide the evaluation report for this tender.

Response

We are able to confirm that we do hold the information contained within the scope of your request.

Section 43 - Commercial interests

The information requested engages section 43(2) of the FOIA as its release would be likely to, prejudice the commercial interests of the Agency and of the contractor.

Section 43 is a qualified exemption. This means that in order to withhold information under this exemption, we must consider the public interest in disclosure.

Public Interest Test – Factors in favour of disclosure

Homes England is compliant with the government agenda of transparency and recognises the benefit of publishing the information, particularly when it concerns how Homes England undertakes its work.

Public Interest Test – Factors in favour of non-disclosure

Homes England believes that it should not disclose information contained within the tender documentation for the winning contractor (AW Demolition LTD).

The contract has very recently been awarded to the third party and the Agency considers the information to be commercial sensitive if it were to be disclosed to the wider public. We believe that to disclose the tender documentation would be likely to prejudice the commercial interests of the third party and would also pose a threat to the Agency's procurement process.

To disclose copies of the tender documents would be likely to prejudice ongoing and future commercial and contractual obligations between the Agency and third party concerned. This would prejudice the ability of Homes England to effectively manage the terms of the procurement which would not be an effective use of public money.

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It is also our view that disclosure of the tender documentation could be detrimental concerning the future requests of a similar nature, if the wider public is provided with information it could be used to exploit the procurement process for profit or other gain.

After careful consideration we have concluded that at this time, the balance of the public interest favours the nondisclosure of the tender documentation that is held.
