Thank you for your email of 12 November 2019 requesting the following information:

'How much is spent on housing the Armed Forces with private rent January 2018 to November 2019 and locations'.

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD) and I can confirm that some of the information in scope of your request is held.

The cost to the MOD of Substitute Service Families Accommodation (SSFA) during the period 01 January 2018 to 30 October 2019 can be found in the table below –
