JUDGMENT ON REMEDY

The unanimous Judgment of the Tribunal is that:

- 1. The claimant's application for reconsideration of the Judgment dated 7 June 2019 is refused.
- 2. In respect of the claimant's claim of unfair dismissal the claimant is awarded a compensatory award of £1243.60 and the respondent is ordered to pay that sum to the claimant.
- 3. In respect of the claimant's claim of victimisation and being subject to detriment due to making a protected disclosure, the claimant is awarded the sum of £7500 in respect of injury to feelings and the respondent is ordered to pay that sum to the claimant.
- 4. In respect of the claimant's claim of victimisation the claimant is awarded interest of £989.59 and the respondent is ordered to pay that sum to the claimant.
- 5. By consent, in respect of the claimant's claim of non-payment of accrued holiday pay, the claimant is awarded the sum of £34 and the respondent is ordered to pay that sum to the claimant.
- 6. In respect of the claim of unauthorised deduction of wages, the claimant award is awarded the sum of £199.12 and the respondent is ordered to pay that sum to the claimant.
- 7. The Respondent is ordered to pay to the claimant the sum of £960 due to failing to provide the claimant with a written statement of terms and conditions.
