Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is 07 April 2020.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of exchanges of statements of case and comments on statements of case.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert part of public footpath No.15, which presently runs from Point A (OS SE 2615 5814) and continues in a south easterly direction on an unmade surface for approximately 30 metres to Point B (OS SE 2618 5812). The new Footpath will commence from Point C (OS SE 2618 5813) and continue in a south south westerly direction for approximately 7 metres to Point B (OS SE 2618 5812) where it will join with the existing Public Right of Way (Nidderdale Rural Path Ref No. 8). The entirety of the diverted route is to be grassed.

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 14 July 2020]

This order is made by Harrogate Borough Council under section 257 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 because it is satisfied that it is necessary to divert the footpath to which this order relates in order to enable development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission (16/04554/FUL) granted under Part 3 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 namely: the demolition of an existing barn and erection of a detached dwelling.

BY THIS ORDER:

- 1. The footpath over the land shown by a bold black line on the attached map and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order ("the Schedule") shall be diverted as provided below.
- 2. There shall be created to the reasonable satisfaction of Harrogate Borough Council an alternative highway for use as a replacement for the said footpath as provided in Part 2 of the Schedule and shown by bold black dashes on the attached map.
- 3. The diversion of the footpath shall have effect on the date on which Harrogate Borough Council certify that the terms of Article 2 above have been complied with.
- 4. The following works shall be carried out in relation to the highway described in Part 2 of the Schedule: a surface of 2 metres in width to be grassed along the entire length.
- 5. Cruet Farm Investments Limited are hereby required to pay for the cost of carrying out the said works.
- 6. Where immediately before the date on which the footpath is diverted there is apparatus under, in, on, over along or across it belonging to statutory undertakers for the purpose of carrying on their undertaking, the undertakers shall continue to have the same rights in respect of the apparatus as they then had.
