PROPOSED SHOREHAM PORT AUTHORITY HARBOUR REVISION ORDER 2020 APPLICATION FOR A HARBOUR REVISION ORDER: NOTICE OF LOCAL CONSULTATION – EXTENT OF HARBOUR PREMISES

Shoreham Port Authority ("the applicant") applied to the Marine Management Organisation ("MMO") for a harbour revision order under section 14 of the Harbours Act 1964 in December 2018. Prior to final determination of the application, a further 21 day local public consultation is being carried out regarding the extent of the additional areas of land that will currently form part of the statutory port premises once the proposed HRO is in force. These areas are all owned by the applicant and are shown on the plan in Annex 1 of the updated Statement of Support.

Once part of the statutory port premises, the applicant will be able to exercise its statutory enforcement powers over them, including the extended powers of General Direction provided for under the proposed HRO covering vehicles (including speed limits and parking) and directions given for the ease, convenience or safety of port operations ashore.

Any person desiring to make an objection or representation concerning the extent of the additional areas of land currently forming part of the port premises under the proposed HRO, should write to the Marine Licensing Team, Marine Management Organisation, Lancaster House, Hampshire Court, Newcastle Upon Tyne, NE4 7YH or email to harbourorders@marinemanagement.org.uk. An objection or representation **should**:

- be received before the expiry of a period of 21 days starting with the date at the foot of this notice;
- ii. be made in writing quoting reference HRO/2018/00004;
- iii. state the grounds of the objection or representation;
- iv. indicate who is making the objection or representation; and
- v. give an address to which correspondence relating to the objection or representation may be sent.

The MMO will pass to the applicant and their relevant representatives a copy of any objections and other representations received.

Any representations duly made will be considered before the MMO decides whether or not to make the order.
