The COVID-19 pandemic has caused MoJ to have to change its data gathering, access and release practices, focusing efforts on priority analysis and statistics. Our <u>statement</u> explains this further and in particular, we are pausing access to the Police National Computer, to minimise non-essential travel by our analysts. In line with <u>guidance</u> from the Office for Statistics Regulation, the decision has been made to delay the publishing of cautions data and the offending histories chapter of this publication. We will keep users updated of any further changes via our published release calendar.





The number of individuals **prosecuted** or given an **out of court disposal** was **1.52 million** in 2019, 1% lower than in 2018 when excluding cautions.




Number of individuals (in thousands) who were:


The overall use of **out of court disposals** continues to decline. In the latest year there has been a


7% fall in the use of **penalty notice for disorders**, an 18% fall in the use of **cannabis/khat warnings** and the use of **community resolutions** has remained stable.



Prosecutions and convictions


1.37 million defendants were **prosecuted** at magistrates' courts in 2019. **Prosecutions** for **violence against the person** offences **increased** in the latest year driven by the **introduction of legislation on assaults of emergency workers**.





Remands


The proportion of defendants **remanded on bail** has continued to fall. The proportion of defendants **remanded in custody** has remained broadly stable at **magistrates' court** (4%) but has been increasing since 2016 at **Crown Court** (37%).




Sentencing

Custody rate




Fines remained the most common sentence overall, up by 11 percentage points since 2009.



In 2019, a greater proportion of offenders received **custody** for **indictable offences** than any other outcome, up 7 percentage points since 2009.

Motoring
