Distribution: Ports, Shipping Agents and Masters

Exemptions, Hazmat, and Merchant Shipping Notice (MSN) 1899

This Advice Note serves as a reminder of CERS exemption processes, reporting requirements relating to hazardous materials, and information on the new Merchant Shipping Notice (MSN).

- 1. Exemptions are available for scheduled services as detailed in <u>Marine Guidance Note 438</u>. Further exemption information can be found on the *FAQ and help* tab of the Workbook.
- 2. Waste exemptions are available as detailed in <u>Marine Guidance Note 563</u> and can be applied for by vessels on scheduled routes. All vessels must complete the *Waste* tab of the CERS Workbook unless an exemption is in place: an MCA approved Waste Management Plan does not exempt vessels from reporting their waste notification to CERS.
- Operators are reminded that the *Outgoing Hazmat* tab must be completed as necessary on vessel departure, and therefore, if required, the updated CERS Workbook must be uploaded multiple times to ensure all information is captured.
- 4. Our new Merchant Shipping Notice <u>MSN 1899</u> is now available online. As stipulated during the consultation exercise in November 2019, no new requirements have been introduced: this document merely combines the information contained in MSN 1831 and MIN 540.
