## **Additional Information**

### **Designation Order 2014 – Claimant Consent**

Junior Johnson's letter, dated 26<sup>th</sup> February 2014, concerning Designation Order 2014 was sent to all Contracted Employment Provision Providers.

Work Choice providers should be clear that this DO is specifically intended to cover only the Work Programme. Our legal advisers have now confirmed that it refers to participants in mandatory programmes only; it does not cover communications with employers about participants who are not benefit claimants; nor communications with employers for the purposes of managing outcome payments where the programme concerned does not have a mandatory referral mechanism.

Work Choice providers must continue to obtain appropriate participant consent, as usual.

### **PRaP Exit Dates**

Providers are reminded that when a participant leaves the Work Choice programme the exit date **must** be recorded in PRaP **promptly**.
