Buckinghamshire County Council (Parish of Great Missenden) Definitive Map Modification Order 2016

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is 25 February 2020

Consideration of the Order will take the form of a public local inquiry.

The Inquiry will be held at Prestwood Village Hall, 1 Wycombe Road, Prestwood, Great Missenden, Bucks HP16 ONZ on Tuesday 18 August 2020 at 11.00am.

Consideration of the Order will now take the form of exchanges of statements of case and comments on statements of case. Final comments to be submitted by 21 July 2020.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by adding to them the footpath from point A at SP8745-0008 in a generally south easterly direction for approximately 177 metres to point B at SU8760-9999 then south for approximately 188 metres to point C at SU8765-9981 as shown by a bold broken line and having a width of 1.5 metres throughout as shown on the map.

<u>Timetable for sending in statements of case and proofs of evidence</u>

Within 8 weeks of the start date by [by 21 April 2020]

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be

available to view at the Authority's offices) to everyone who has made an objection or representation and the applicant and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 2 June 2020]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their statement of case¹ is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send full copies to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

4 weeks before the date of the inquiry [by 21 July 2020]

The Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their proof of evidence (together with any summary) is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of:

- i) the Authority's proof of evidence to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and anyone who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence);
- ii) the applicant's proof of evidence to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence); and
- iii) all other proofs of evidence to the Authority, the applicant, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence).

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case and proofs of evidence are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.


THE BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT

This Order is made by Buckinghamshire County Council ("the Authority") under section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the Act") because it appears to that authority that the Buckinghamshire County Council Definitive Map and Statement require modification in consequence of an occurrence of an event specified in section 53(3)(b) namely, the expiration, in relation to any way in the area to which the map relates, of any period such that the enjoyment by the public of the way during that period raises a presumption that the way has been dedicated as a public path or restricted byway.

The authority has consulted with every local authority whose area includes the land to which the order relates. The Buckinghamshire County Council hereby order that:

- 1. For the purposes of this order the relevant date is the First day of August 2016.
- 2. The Buckinghamshire County Council Definitive Map and Statement shall be modified as described in Part I and Part II of the Schedule and shown on the map attached to the order.
- This order shall take effect on the date it is confirmed and may be cited as the The Buckinghamshire County Council (Parish of Great Missenden) Definitive Map Modification Order 2016.
