Hampshire County Council (Test Valley Borough No. 13) (Parish of Braishfield - Footpath No. 4) Public Path Diversion and Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2018

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The start date for the above Order is 30 June 2020.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of exchanges of statements of case and comments on statements of case.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be **to divert** part of Braishfield Footpath 4, commencing at a junction with Paynes Hay Road, SU3690 2561 proceeding over a stile in a generally south eastward direction, along a field edge to a stile, along natural path to field edge at SU3711 2540 **to a** footpath 2 metres wide, commencing at a junction with Paynes Hay Road SU 3679 2557, through pedestrian gate, along field edge, south eastwards, then south westwards, bearing east at SU 3682 2535 continuing to SU 3711 2540.

## Within 2 weeks of the start date [by 14 July 2020]

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

## Within 8 weeks of the start date [by 25 August 2020]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation or any other written representation or any other person wishing to make representations in writing must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send full copies to the Authority. Copies (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) will also be sent to the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

## Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 06 October 2020]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation, the Authority, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who has written to us in respect of the Order must ensure that their comments on any or every other statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of these comments to everyone else.

In fairness to the other parties <u>everyone should keep to the timetable</u> to ensure that statements of case and comments are received on time. Late documents will be returned.

We cannot accept any inflammatory, discriminatory or abusive comments. Any documents containing such comments will be returned.

# HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

## THE HAMPSHIRE (TEST VALLEY BOROUGH NO.13) (PARISH OF BRAISHFIELD – FOOTPATH NO.4) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER 2018

This Order is made by Hampshire County Council ("the authority") under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the authority that in the interests of the owner of the land crossed by the footpath described in paragraph 1 of this order it is expedient that the line of the path should be diverted.

This Order is also made under section 53A(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the 1981 Act") because it appears to the authority that the Hampshire Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way (dated 15<sup>th</sup> December 2007) require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in section 53(3)(a)(i) of the 1981 Act, namely, the diversion (as authorised by this order) of a highway shown or required to be shown in the map and statement.

The applicants, Mr and Mrs Clake, have agreed to defray any compensation which becomes payable in consequence of the coming into force of this Order and any expenses which are incurred in bringing the new path into a fit condition for use by the public.

Test Valley Borough Council has been consulted as required by Section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

#### BY THIS ORDER:

- 1. The public right of way over the land situated at Braishfield and shown by a bold continuous line on the map contained in this Order and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order shall be stopped up when Hampshire County Council has certified that the work necessary to bring the site of the new footpath, specified in paragraph 3 below, into a fit condition for use by the public has been carried out, and thereupon the Hampshire Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way (dated 15<sup>th</sup> December 2007) shall be modified by deleting from it that public right of way.
- 2. Notwithstanding this Order all Statutory Undertakers shall have the same rights over the land referred to in paragraph 1 as they have hitherto enjoyed.

- 3. There shall be from the date of confirmation of this Order a public footpath over the land situate at Braishfield described in Part 2 of the Schedule and shown by a bold broken line on the map contained in this Order, and thereupon the Hampshire Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way (dated 15<sup>th</sup> December 2007) shall be modified by adding that footpath to it.
- 3A. The Hampshire Definitive Statement of Public Rights of Way (dated 15<sup>th</sup> December 2007) shall be modified as described in Part 4 of the Schedule to this Order.

That part of Footpath No.4 in the Parish of Braishfield, in the Borough of Test Valley, commencing at a junction with Paynes Hay Road, SU 3690 2561 (Point A on the Order map), proceeding over a stile in a generally south eastward direction, along field edge to a stile, along natural path to field edge at Point B on the Order plan (SU 3711 2540).

A footpath 2 metres wide, in the Parish of Braishfield, in the Borough of Test Valley, commencing at a junction with Paynes Hay Road SU 3679 2557 (Point D on the plan), through pedestrian gate, along a 2 metre wide grass field edge, south eastwards, then south westwards along field, bearing east at SU 3682 2535 (Point C) continuing along 2 metre wide field edge path to Point B on the plan. A total length of 546 metres.
