Thank you for your email of 6 March 2020 requesting the following information:

"Could you please let me know how many Armed Forces Compensation Scheme application have been turned down due to "reasonable doubt" in the last 10 years?"

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that all the information in scope of your request is held. However, we will not be able to answer your request without exceeding the appropriate limit.

This is because there is no marker on the Compensation and Pension computer system to identify those cases rejected under reasonable doubt. In order to provide the information requested, we would have to manually examine each case where a rejection occurred in the last 10 years. Using published data, we have been able to establish that during the year 2018-2019 alone there were in excess of 24,000 rejected claims under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme. If we allow ten minutes to examine each case rejected during 2018-2019, this equates to 4,000 hours to locate, retrieve and extract the relevant data.

Section 12 of the Act makes provision for public authorities to refuse requests for information where the cost of dealing with them would exceed the appropriate limit, which is set at £600. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 3.5 working days in determining whether the department holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting it.
