Thank you for your correspondence of 11 June 2020 requesting the following information:

"Does your country pay its Air Force pilots for every flying hour they book or use a different system of remuneration?"

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

The Royal Air Force (RAF) does not pay pilots per flying hour. The majority of Royal Air Force (RAF) pilots are paid the normal military salary for their rank, irrespective of hours flown. In addition to the normal military salary, these pilots receive a Retention and Recruitment Payment.

Some pilots with a minimum of 16 years of service and who perform at an above-average level in flight may receive the bespoke salary of the Professional Aviator Salary Spine.

If you are not satisfied with this response or wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance Team, Ground Floor, MoD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail <u>CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk</u>). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not normally investigate your case until the MoD internal process has been completed.
