Thank you for your email received by the Ministry Of Defence on 12th June 2020 requesting the following information:

- "How many soldiers and officers are currently serving in the Royal Military Police.
- How many soldiers and officers in the Royal Military Police are female.
- How many soldiers and officers in the Royal Military Police are reservists.
- How many airmen and officers are currently serving in the Royal Air Force Police.
- How many airmen and officers in the Royal Air Force Police are female.
- How many airmen and officers in the Royal Air Force Police are reservists."

We are treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

We have now completed a search for the information you requested and I can confirm that the information in scope of your request is held.

As to part 1, 2 and 3 of your request the data is held and is contained in Table 1.

As to part 4, 5 and 6 of your request the data is held and is contained in Table 2.

- 3. Personnel with a Paid Rank of Colonel and above have been attributed as STAFF and therefore been excluded from these figures.
