Thank you for your e-mail of 18 June 2020 asking for information about flying hours. You requested the following information:

To receive the fleet flying hours for 2019-20 for the following aircraft:

i) Typhoon; ii) C-130; iii) C-17; iv) A400M; v) Voyager; vi) E-3 Sentry; vii) Rivet Joint; viii) R-1 Sentinel; ix) Hawk (all variants - if broken down, OK); x) Chinook; xi) Apache (all variants); xii) Merlin Mk2; xiii) Merlin Mk4 (incl any aircraft still in works, so they would be Mk3s); xiv) Puma (all versions); xv) RN Lynx Wildcat; xvi) AAC Lynx Wildcat; xvii) F-35B Lightning II.

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) which was due on 17 July 2020. Please accept my apologies for the late response. We have now completed a search of our paper and electronic records for the information you requested, and I can confirm that information within the scope of your request is held.
